

Then Morgan Baker stepped forward from the audience.

"This whole discussion needs a little airing from the other side." he declared, after saying he was a friend of "Bill" Mulock. He said that the matter of North Toronto Bible House mail had been submitted to W. S. Edwards, Deputy Minister of Justice, who is also a Baptist.

"He was solely responsible and Lapointe knew nothing of what had been done; he was never consulted." Mr. Baker asserted. He said that he had left Ottawa only the day before this meeting and proceeded to remove pamphlets from an inside pocket. "These are the reasons for the post office ban," he declared, tossing them on the table.

Dr. Shields: "Will you read those pamphlets?"

Mr. Baker: "No. I wouldn't let my children read them and I would not read them here before this assembly."

Cries from the audience: 'Read

Mr. Taylor: "I am accused of distributing these and I never did it." Mr. Baker read correspondence between Mr. Taylor and the department at Ottawa, and said: Mr. Taylor says he does not know why they don't arrest him. Just let Mr. Taylor go out and distribute his literature

and he'll soon find himself stopped. "I have a boy somewhere on the Atlantic at this moment and there are thousands of others. They are fighting for something bigger than Dr. Shields and his friends are arguing about. There are French-Canadian boys there, too; they don't ask who their fellow is. They don't worry about whether he is a Roman

Catholic or Protestant." Dr. Shields: "Mr. Baker has done us a real service here to-night. He is a magnificent example of the type of politician who is selling our country out. Mr. Baker is the type of man who will vote for anything to keep his position. That is why the Roman Catholic Church is having its own way."
