### MUNITIONS ORDER SAYS BINDER TWINE MAY BE USED ONLY BY FARMERS

There is good news for the farmers of Canada in the new Order on hard fibre rope issued recently by the Department of Munitions and Supply. This Order provides that no hard fibre shall be used in the making of tying twine, upholstery, and skipping ropes among other things. It also points out that binder twines may be used only for binding and tying agricultural crops.

Canada is facing a serious shortage of hard fibre, as the main source of supply of these fibres was cut off when the Japanese over-ran the South Seas.

## EXTRA COAL FOR SCHOOL BUILDING

Chairman of the School Board Mr. Ira Aldred announced on Monday evening at the regular meeting that an extra ten tons of coal had to be ordered for the big knowledge works, due to the stiff, long winter. 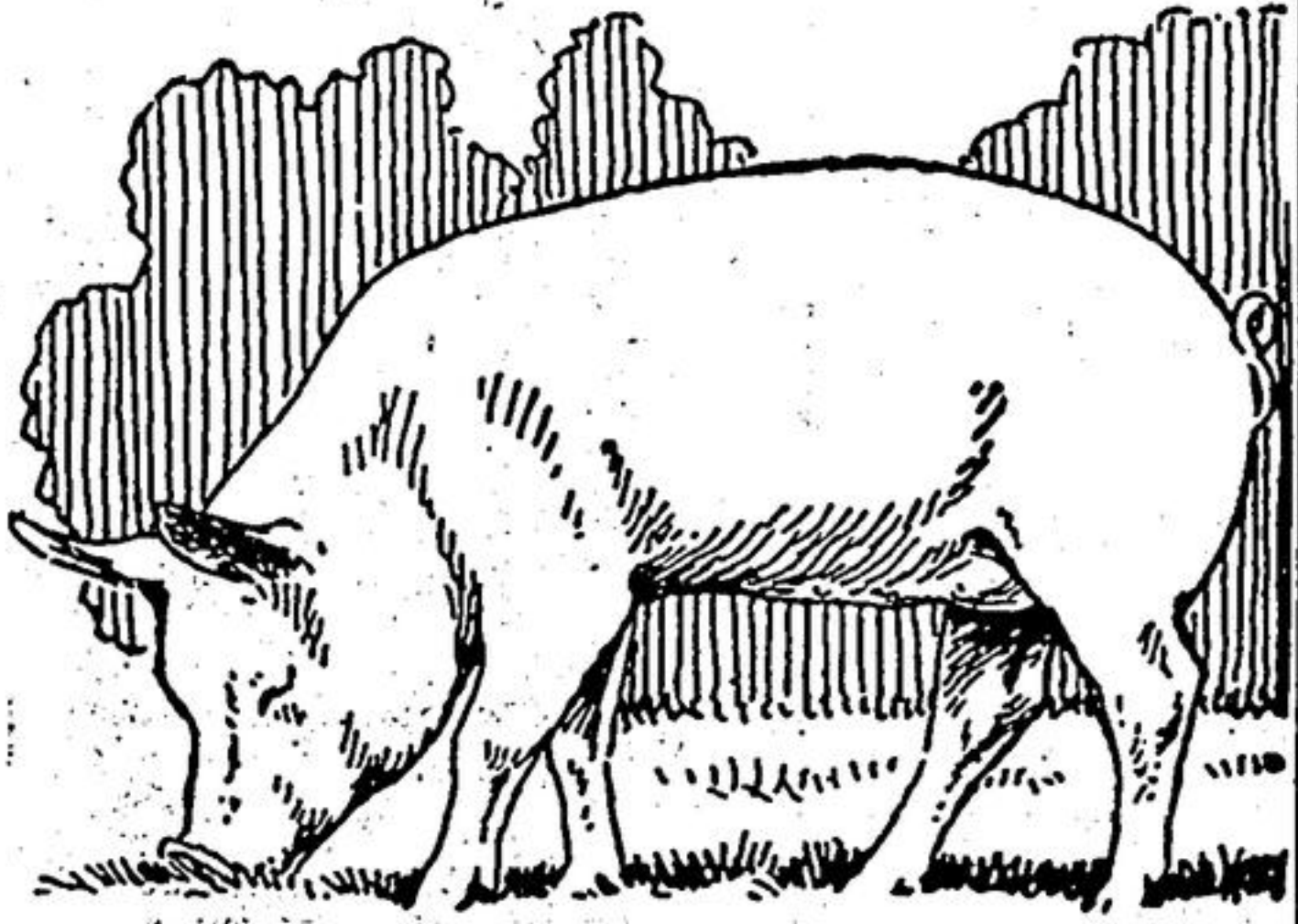
