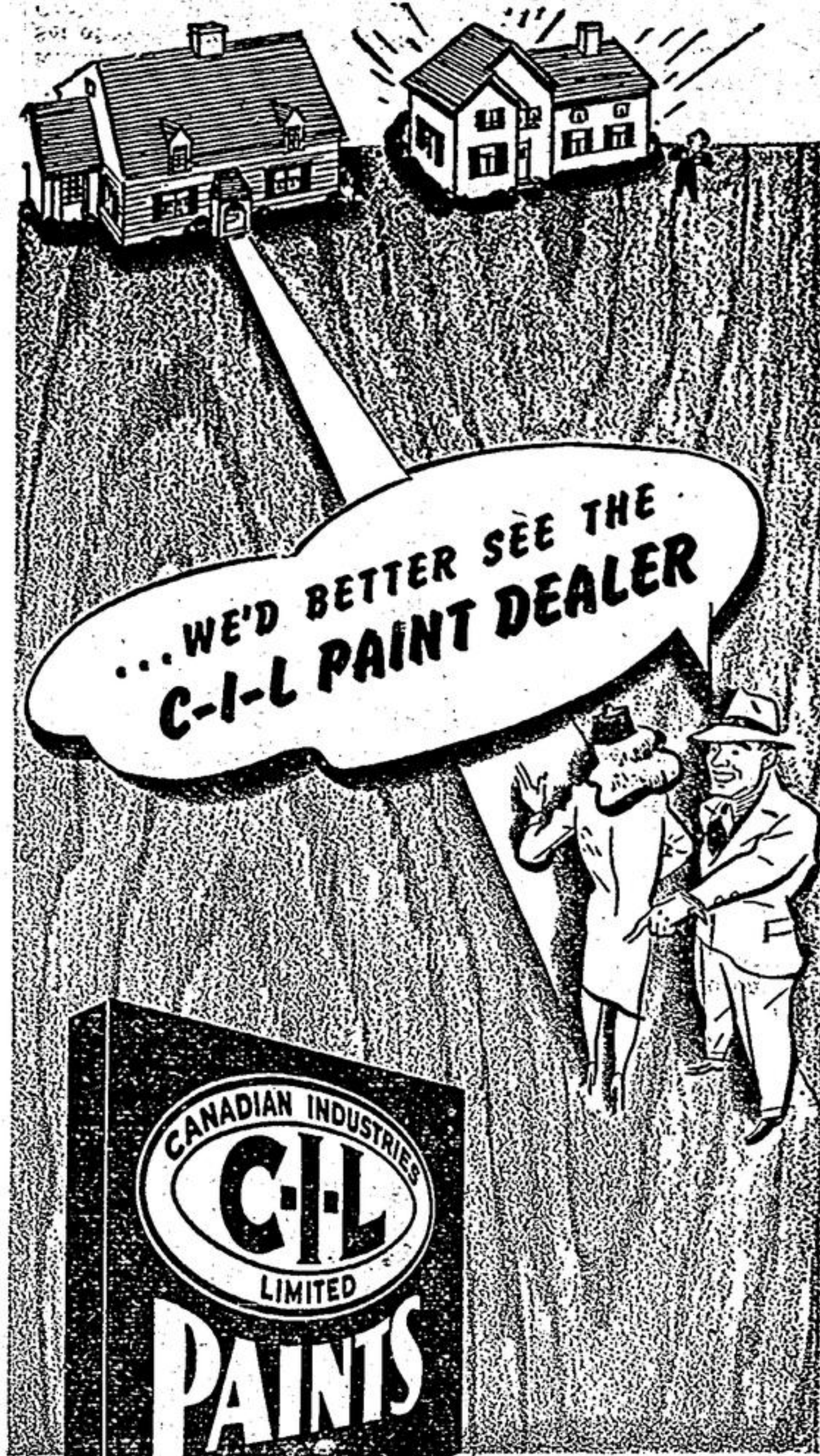

WILL ASSIGN CONCHIES FARM WORK

Labor Minister Mitchell announced plans to use conscientious objectors on farms and in essential industries, effective May 1, so their services may be utilized to greater advantage than at present.

He told the House of Commons that "Conscientious objectors will have the option of refusing to accept employment to which they may have been directed by these officers, in which case they will then be directed to one of the alternative service camps," Mr. Mitchell said.
"Any farmer who engaged a conscientious objector for farm work will be required to pay such wage rate as is fixed by the Minister of Labor, which rate will be from \$35 to \$40 per month, pending upon local conditions.

The Department reserves the right to demand from any successful tenderer, before awarding the order, a security deposit in the form of a certified cheque on a chartered bank in Canada, made payable to the order of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the tender, or Bearer Bonds of the Dominion of Canada or of the Canadian National Railway Company and its constituent companies unconditionally guaranteed as to principal and interest by the Dominion of Canada, or the aforementioned bonds and a certified cheque, if required to make up an odd amount. Such security will serve as a guarantee for the proper fulfilment of the contract.
