POTATOES LEAD AGAIN IN PRICE VIOLATIONS

Violators of the potato price ceiling again led the list of 131 persons who were convicted of infractions against war-time orders and regulations during last week. Four retailers and three consumers were dealt fines ranging from \$300 to \$5 for breaches of rationing regulations. One Toronto restaurant proprietor was fined \$300 for making a false declaration regarding his stock of tea. Five Toronto men were sentenced to prison terms of three to six months for violation of gasoline rationing regulations.
