## 47 CATTLE SELL FOR \$40,400 AT UNIONVILLE AUCTION

In one of the largest cattle dispersals ever held in York County, 47 pure-bred Shorthorns, consigned by three of Ontario's foremost breeders were sold for a total of \$40,400 at the farm of W. J. Russell, Markham Township on Monday.

Top selling animals at the sale were three consigned by W. J. Russell, which brought an average of \$2,500 each. "Klaymor Gaffer," a female, was purchased by Wallace Mackey of Weston; Klaymor Jim, a bull, was bought by Kinsman Brothers of Cromarty, Ont., while "Braedon Broadhooks," a female, went to Captain C. Munford of Hampton.

The dispersal, sixth of its type, was originated in 1937 by Mr. Russell, K. C. Gray of Gormley and Stanley Douglas of Caledonia. Each year the three breeders combine in one big sale.

When the day's bidding was tallied at the end of the sale, records showed that 47 head of cattle brought in an average of \$940 per head.

Eight of Russell's bulls drew an average of \$1,107, while 12 females of the Russell stock were purchased for an average of \$1,077. Mr. Gray offered 6 females and collected an average of \$1,375.
