

Typical questions consumers have asked the Wartime Prices and Trade Board this week are answered below by the Central Ontario Consumer Branch Committee.

Q .- I understand the tea and coffee Would you kindly explain how we get that extra one-third, of an ounce?

A.—Yes, the tea and coffee ration was increased by one-third.
