ANTI-FASCIST LEADER



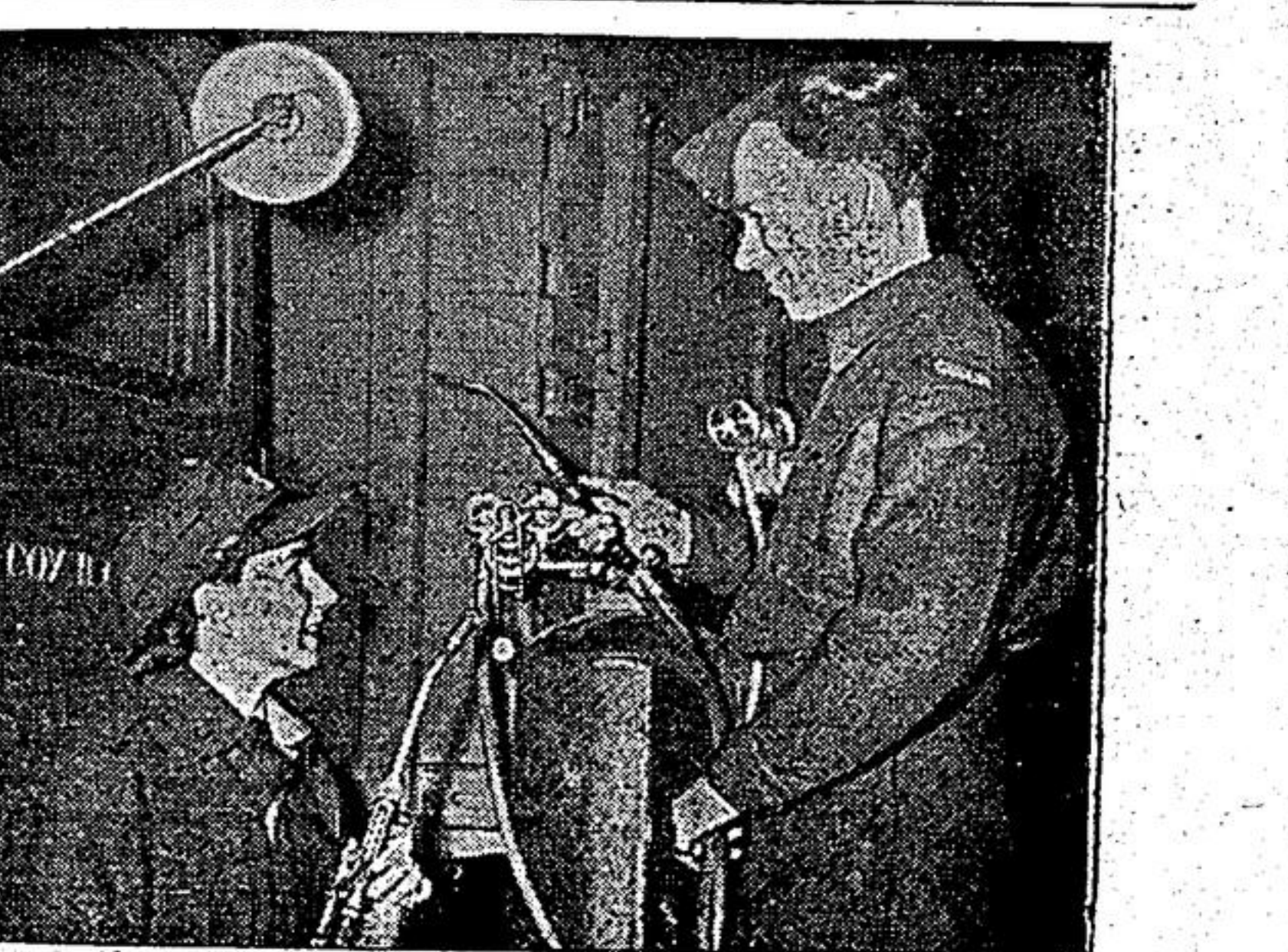

It was a good thing, he said, that such a time as this gathering of this kind should be held, helping us to forget for a brief time at least those things that caused us much anxiety and worry.

Seed rain Shortage
Of chief concern among the farmers this year, Mr. Campbell told the gathering, was the shortage of feed grain owing to the reduced crop production caused by unfavorable weather conditions. Grain, however, which was sold in the spring and benefited from fairly good weather has shown a good yield. There should be a very serious shortage of seed grain this year, Mr. Campbell said and farmers were advised to let no opportunities pass to purchase what they could. Sales of grain would be announced in the near future, he said. Mr. Campbell spoke also of the farm mechanics courses to be held again this year, and thanked the county and various township councils for the help and support they had given him in his work this year. "Sometimes a little talk with a reeve helped a lot in the solution of our problems," he said.
