## TOWNLINE COUNTY RD.

(Continued from Front Page). The fact is well known, that the good roads system area around Toronto was instituted as a result of representations made by Toronto. It was felt by the city in those days that paved roads leading to the city would bring business to them. This has proved a fact and now it is established it would be unfair for the city to be relieved of the upkeep of these roads.

The Deputy Reeve also pointed to a report presented on the set-up of the suburban roads, as made by the special committee on roads for York County Council. They are divided into three classes the report points out, suburban, county, and township. Suburban roads are maintained at a cost of 50 per cent by the province, 25 each by the city of Toronto and the County of York. Cost of county roads are borne 50 per cent each by the county and the province, and township roads are paid for by the municipality subject to the usual 50 per cent grant from the Dept. of Highways.

Mr. Evans stated that the proposed new road around Wilcox Lake sponsored a few years ago had been abandoned since the cost was too great between \$14,000 and \$15,000 for new right of way alone. The Markham-Whitchurch townline from the 6th concession over to Yonge St. through Gormley had been taken over as a county road instead.

The north townline taken over by the county a few years ago has been turned back to the municipalities.
