Ottawa Lifts Ban on **Bible Students**

A House of Commons committee studying the Defense of Canada Regulations in 1942 recommended that the ban on the organizations, which included the Communist Party, be lifted, but the report was not adopted by the Commons.

The Canadian office of Jehovah's Witnesses at Toronto announced that the ban on the organization's legal corporation, the International Bible Students' Association of America, was removed by an order dated June 13th.

The ban was placed on the Wit-nesses and on the association in 1940 and that on the Witnesses was removed last October.

This will mean, it is understood, that the literature of the Watchtower Publishing Company may again be distributed in Canada.


