### LOCUST HILL CHILD FATALLY INJURED

Robert Eves Ran Out From Behind Bread Truck  
 Two-year-old Robert Eves, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Eves, R.R. 1, Locust Hill, was fatally injured when struck by a car driven by Flight-Lieut. A. E. Manser, No. 1, R.C.A.F. Training Command, Toronto, on No. 7 highway, one and a half miles east of Green River at 4:10 Friday afternoon.  
 A bread truck which had been proceeding west, was stopped on the highway and the driver Albert Labery, accompanied by two small children was at the rear of the truck apparently removing bread. As Manser was passing the truck the Eves child ran out from behind it and was struck by the car.  
 He was taken to the Oshawa General Hospital suffering from a fractured skull and laceration of the brain and died before midnight.  
 Dr. H. C. Hall, of Oshawa, was the attending physician and the coroner, Dr. H. M. MacDonald of Oshawa, was called. Provincial Constable George Yuile of Oshawa, investigated the accident.  
 It has not yet been decided if there will be an inquest.

### Dogs Attack Seven Flocks of Sheep in Markham

Exceptionally heavy damage was caused by mutton-eating dogs roaming over Markham township the past four weeks. No less than seven flocks were attacked in a fairly wide area extending from the 1st concession to as far east as the Fred Cole farm on the 9th and Albert Brown's, 10th con. Total damage for which compensation was paid by Markham council on Monday when in general meeting ran to \$648. While some 25 sheep or lambs were killed outright considerable more damage was caused the flocks, and over half the compensation was for flock damage.  
 B. Watford, Gormley, R.R.2, probably suffered the greatest loss and was awarded \$305, while Fred Cole east of Markham, was ordered paid \$100. Others received: Harry White, Gormley R.R. 2, \$20; Harold Mackie, Richmond Hill, \$78; Albert Brown, Stouffville, \$60; Mrs. Fred Johnson, Unionville, \$35; J. Bull, Jefferson, \$50. It is the largest kill made by roaming dogs for some considerable time. Only in one instance, that of Albert Brown, were the dogs caught in the act, and one shot on the spot.  
 The Dept. of Game and Fisheries reported that over 100 pheasants were deposited in the township last week, of which 90 were laying hen birds and the remainder cock birds. They were all freed at suitable points and the layers will go to work at once it is expected so that they may multiply greatly before the next shoot comes around.  
 A bylaw was passed appointing the following four persons as sheep valuers: C. S. Boynton, Gordon Lunau, Wm. Brooke, and Hugh Boyd. They will be paid \$3 per visit and 10c. per mile for travelling.  
 Reeve Chas. Hooper presided over the session which did not convene until evening. Hospitalization charges paid totalled \$167.38. Chief accounts passed were for road work, of which main items were \$2700 to F. Roberts for 1800 yards of gravel at \$1.50, and another account for 95 yards \$142.50. The Brunner Mond Co. was ordered paid \$1106.80 for 40 tons of calcium. It was reported that every street in Unionville had just been oiled and a splendid job had been obtained.
