### SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Golden Text.—Seek those things which are above.—Col. 3:1

The Lesson as a Whole  
Approach to the Lesson

For the sincere, conscientious Christian, the temperance question should be solved readily, for it simply amounts to this: What is my responsibility to God in regard to the care of my body? When I recognize the fact that I have been bought with a price, even the precious blood of Christ (1 Cor. 6:20) and that my body rightfully belongs to God (Rom. 12:1), I shall see the folly and incongruity of any indulgence which needlessly tends to weaken my physical and mental powers, and so I will shun intoxicants and narcotics of every kind, even as I will refuse to allow myself to be defiled by unclean habits of any description (Eph. 5:11, 12).

If one has not yet received Christ as Saviour and confessed Him as Lord, the problem may not seem so easy of solution. But any self-respecting young person ought to be able to see the unwisdom of taking up practices which tend to degrade and weaken him, thus unfitting him for the duties of life and endangering his entire future, because of the terrible power which evil habits wield over those who fall victims to them.

A proper regard for the sanctity of human nature should be sufficient to keep one from these evils.

by occupation with Christ, which results in the constant renewing of the mind — daily conformity to the will of God.

Chap. 13:12.—"The night is far spent, the day is at hand." The night of man's day, closing up his own vain efforts to find a way out of the confusion brought in by sin will soon be over. Then will come the day when the Lord will assert Himself and when an entirely new order will be brought in through the personal return of Jesus Christ as King of kings and Lord of lords. With this in view, it becomes all who own allegiance to Him, to refuse all that has to do with Satan's kingdom of darkness, and to array himself in "the armour of light" as an acknowledged soldier of the cross.

Verse 13.—"Let us walk honestly," or decently (A.V. margin), as becomes one who belongs to "the day," not giving oneself to sensuality in any form, nor "in strife and envying," for what have the men of the world that will be of value in that coming hour of manifestation? It ill becomes a joint heir with Christ to permit himself to sink down to the depths of immorality and earthly mindedness that mark those who know nothing of the regenerating power of God.

Verse 14.—"Make not provision for the flesh, to fulfill the lusts thereof." He who puts on the Lord Jesus Christ, in the sense of acknowledging His union with Him in death and in the power of resurrection life, is to reckon himself dead unto sin in the flesh (Rom. 6:11), and, through the control of the indwelling Spirit of God, to mortify, that is, to put in the place of death, the deeds of the body (Rom. 8:11) which, if allowed to have their way, would lead to self-indulgence and lasciviousness of the vilest nature (Col. 3:5).

The Heart of the Lesson  
God created man for His glory. As originally made, he was designed to have authority over all the lower creation. But sin has brought man down to the low level of "the beasts that perish" (Psa. 49:12), so that he readily becomes the slave of all kinds of fleshly lusts and passions which tend to degradat-

ion and dishonor. But when born from above and indwelt by the Holy Spirit, man is renewed in "the image of him that created him" (Col. 3:10), thus enabling him to triumph over perverted appetites and keep the body in the place of subjection (1 Cor. 9:27). In this way, the body glorifies God (1 Cor. 6:20) and is delivered from the power of carnal lusts, so fulfilling the "righteousness of the law" (Rom. 8:4).

## Training and Education — Doorways to Opportunity

### SOCIAL SECURITY MEASURES

In planning Canada's re-establishment program, its framers worked with one principal idea in mind. This was that the only answer to the problem of permanent re-establishment is a job, and that the surest way to get and hold that job is by the skill necessary for it.

### VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Every ex-service man or woman who will be assisted in re-establishment by training is eligible to have it. There is provision for paying fees for all courses and, in addition, the ex-service man or woman may receive maintenance grants up to:

- \$60 monthly if single;
- \$80 monthly for a man and his wife, together with children's allowances.

### EDUCATIONAL TRAINING

This is available to all who are admitted to university within 15 months of discharge and, as in vocational training, fees are paid and there are maintenance allowances up to:

- \$60 monthly for a single man;
- \$80 monthly for a man and his wife, together with allowances for dependent children.

These allowances will be continued on a month for month basis of the time in the services, providing all examinations are passed. Outstanding students may have assistance continued to completion of the course.

### SOCIAL SECURITY MEASURES

Under the re-establishment program Canada's veterans who, within 18 months of discharge from the services, become ill or unemployed may draw maintenance allowances up to \$50 if single and \$70 for a man and his wife, together with children's allowances. The out-of-work benefits are for those fit and able to work, but for whom there is no work immediately available. In the case of serious illness there is free treatment and hospitalization for any condition in the year following discharge.

As a further security measure, every veteran who enters insurable employment is entitled, after 15 weeks in that employment, to unemployment insurance credit as though the whole period in the services since July 1, 1941, had been spent in the insurable employment.

VETERANS' WELFARE OFFICERS ARE STATIONED IN KEY CENTRES THROUGHOUT CANADA. THEY ADVISE AND ASSIST EX-SERVICE PERSONNEL, AND SHOULD BE CONSULTED ON ALL PROBLEMS.
