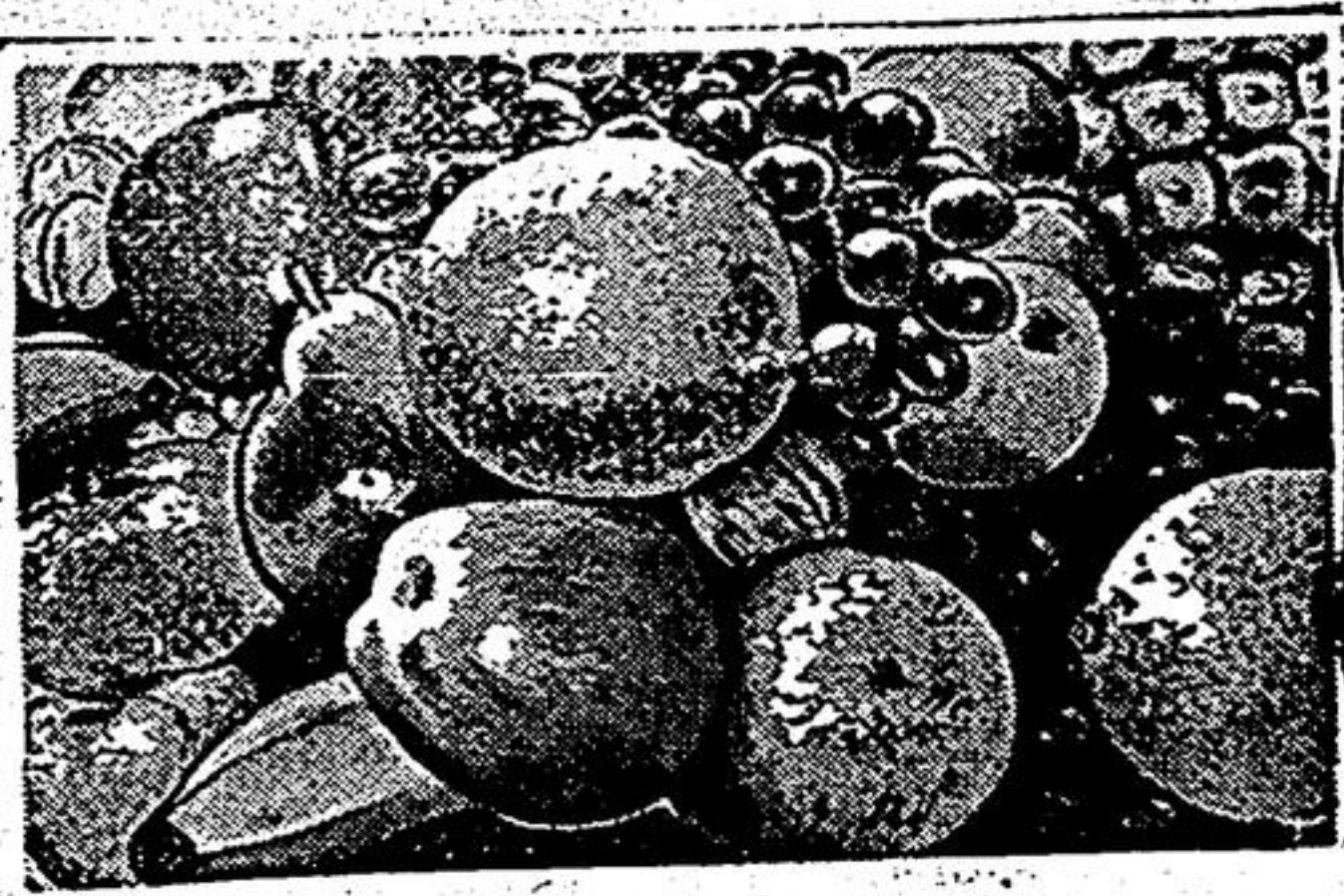

**HOLSTEIN SALES IN COUNTY \$40,000**

The annual meeting and banquet of the Ontario County Holstein Breeders' Club was held Nov. 30th at Uxbridge. President K. E. Holliday, Brooklin, was in charge and there was an attendance of better than 100. The guest speaker was Hon. Geo. S. Henry, Todmorden. He warned Holstein breeders that in seeking for higher test they should not disregard large production since it was her producing ability that has put the Holstein cow where she is today.

Sales agent Jos. Darlington, Todmorden, reported that in the course of the past year he has made total sales of \$170,000 mostly for the breeders of Ontario, York, Peel and Simcoe counties. His Ontario county business alone totalled \$40,000. Last year's total was \$160,000.

R. Norman Hogg, Uxbridge, was chosen as president for 1945 and Wilmot Walker, Uxbridge, as secretary, Harold Honey, Seagrave, and Les. Smith, Port Perry, were added to the Board of Directors.
