127 TEAMS COMPLETE IN CLUB CONTESTS With 127 teams from forty counties of the Province taking part in the inter-county 'championship' boys' and girls' club competitions, held at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, this year reached the largest proportions: experienced since before the war, and gave the large force of judges a difficult task in determining the winners of the Provincial championship trophies. The contests kept the boys and judges busy from 9:30 in the forenoon until after six o'clock in the afternoon, with the dairy cattle class heading the list in numbers with 39 teams. Seven competitions were held, these being in dairy cattle, beef cattle, horses, swine, poultry, grain and potatoes, and five counties figured in the awards of trophies, with two of them, Durham and Middlesex, taking two trophies each. The Durham county boys won the Swine Club competition, and a boy and girl from the same county came first in the Potato Club competition. Middlesex topped the list

Lincoln county won the trophy in poultry judging and Peel headed the list in the grain judging competition. An interesting feature of the competitions was that of five girls who were among the competitors, four were in either first or second place teams. Evelyn Prentice, St. Catharines was on the winning poultry team, and Belle Warnica and Margaret Quinlan, Barrie, formed the second place poultry team. Jean Werry, Enniskillen, was on the trophy winning potato club team from Durham County. The fifth girl, Minnie Charlton, Ilderton, was on the Middlesex County team which was placed fourth in potato judging.
