Mrs. F. Gibson is somewhat improved, after an attack of arthritis. Miss Laurette Pegg spent the weekend at her home.

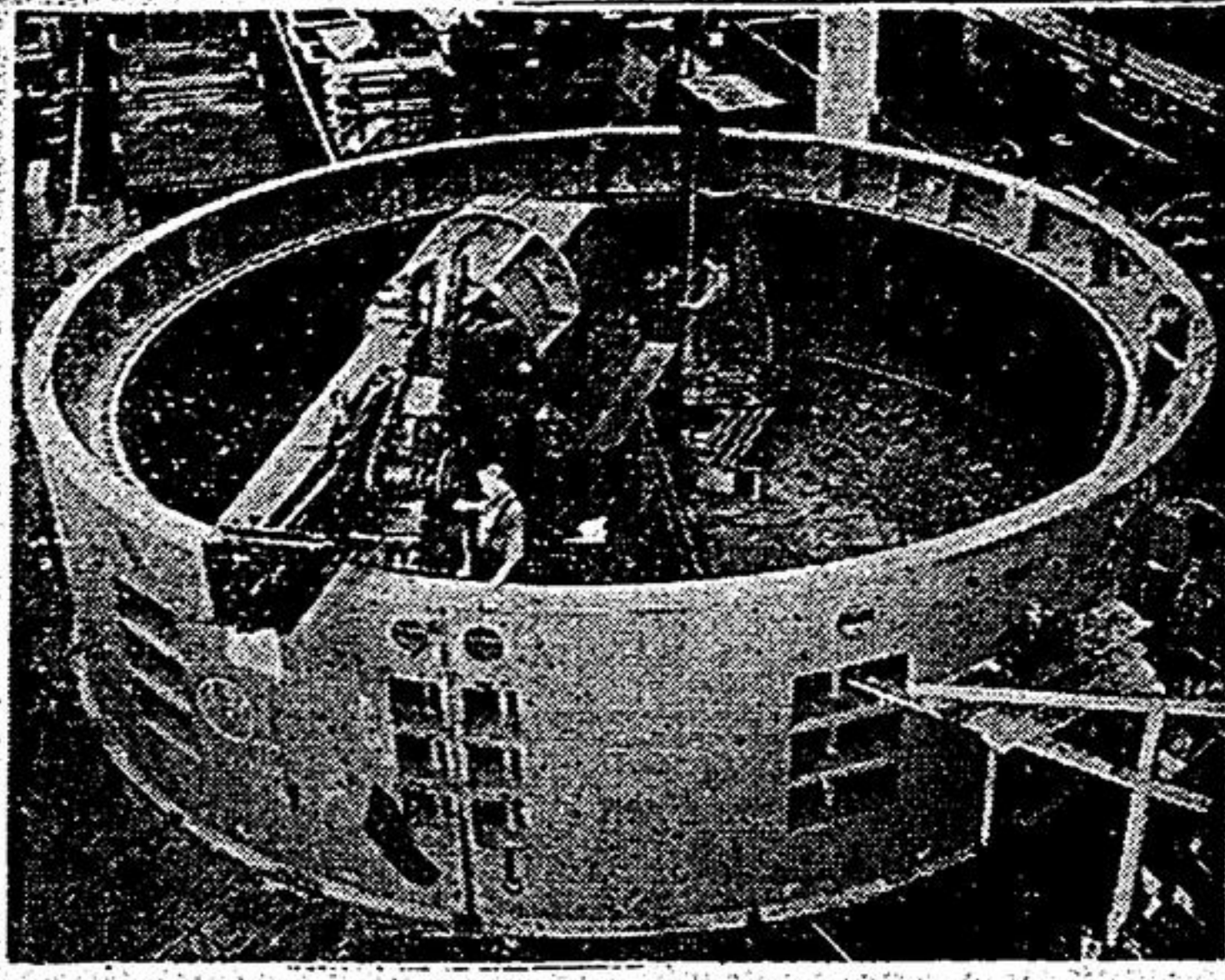


## To The People Of Whitchurch Township

## Provincial Police Survey at Ajax

Investigation Follows Report by Legion that No Protection Afforded 2,400 Residents.

A report on crime conditions and law enforcement in Ajax is being prepared by Provincial Police following a strongly worded resolution forwarded to provincial and federal authorities by Ajax branch of the Canadian Legion.

A survey of conditions in the community has been made by an inspector of Provincial Police and the branch has also received assurance from Ottawa that the matter will be given consideration by federal authorities.

In seeking police protection for the village, which is reported to have a population of 2,400 persons, the Legion points out that previous attempts "have resulted in nothing better than sympathetic consideration with negative results."

Hon. Leslie Blackwell, Attorney General of Ottawa, stated provincial police station in the district have always responded promptly to any calls from Ajax. It has been pointed out to the Ajax group that any municipality wishing a provincial officer assigned to take care of its policing problems has only to enter into an agreement to pay for this service and it will be forthcoming immediately.

The resolution prepared by the Legion admits that provincial officers stationed in Whitty have always responded to calls to Ajax, but points out this condition is unsatisfactory "for the reason that only after an offense or crime has been committed are we able to get any action."

The resolution further charges: "The community of upwards of 2,400 people has had to endure for the past three years rowdiness, drunken disorder, juvenile and adult malicious damage, theft, wanton destruction of property, burglary, aggravated assault, attempted murder, and finally murder."

The resolution was prepared following the killing of Mrs. Audrey Lyons in her Ajax home on Nov. 10. Lorne Cecil Harris, of Ajax, charged with her murder, was committed for trial following preliminary hearing at Whitty last week.

In the resolution it charges: "Since the first two hundred houses were built in Ajax by Wartime Housing Limited, no policing worthy of the name has been done."
