ROYAL WINTER FAIR TO REOPEN NOV. 12

With the horse show revived in all its color and glory as the chief attraction, the Royal Winter Fair is due to reopen on Nov. 12 next after its enforced wartime holiday. Announcement to this effect was made by William Dryden of Brooklin, general manager, at a meeting of the board of directors. "We hope to have the army jumping teams from several of the Allied nations for the horse show," said Mr. Dryden. "The livestock breeders are eager for the fair to reopen and they promise a great display of horses, cattle, sheep and swine." One suggestion is that the \$31,000 bull recently bought by H. Rodanz and now at Stouffville, might be shown. Assurance has been given by the department of national defence that the Coliseum and other quarters used by the Winter Fair will be evacuated by the end of May. "It will keep us busy getting the place ready for the Winter Fair in November," said Mr. Dryden.
