Walter L. Gordon, Toronto, has been named to head a royal commission which will survey wages, working conditions and efficiency of senior administrative personnel in the federal government.





and homes will be levelled. He and his few fellows who are left would have to turn to the wilderness.


Then with all his tools gone he would only be a babe in the woods.
