A Collie pup led William Mc-
Cormack of Popular Grove to his
dying niece on the north shore of
Balsam Lake during the noon hour
last Thursday but the animal's
mission was lost—the woman died
shortly after medical aid had been
obtained.

The dead woman—Miss Eileen
Burton, 35,—had left her home,
which was in the same house as
her uncle and aunt, shortly after
10 a.m. to shoot groundhogs. She
was accompanied by two Collie
pups and carried a .22 calibre rifle.

Around 11 a.m. one of the pups
returned to the house alone, and
sensing something was wrong, the
dead woman's uncle started out to
investigate. The pup led him to the
lakeshore where he found Miss
Burton lying outside one of the
cottages, shot through the head.
Her rifle was on the ground beside
her.

She was still living when Dr. E.
J. Anderson of Kirkfield arrived on
the scene but died within an hour
later. The bullet entered her left
temple and came out her right.

Provincial Officer Taylor investi-
gated the tragedy.

Arthur Robertson, Haliburton,
father of six children, is wonder-
ing what has become of his wife.
According to him she left Halibur-
ton on March 14, to go to Toronto
to fetch home her six-year-old
daughter Audrey, who has been

Mrs. Elizabeth Shackleton, 155 Mc-
Caul St., and has not been heard of
since.

to understand her disappearance
because she was very fond of her
family, five of whom she left

following night.

Mrs. Robertson is described as
being 26 years old, five and a half
feet tall, has dark brown hair, blue
eyes and weighs about 145 pounds.
When last seen she was wearing a
light blue coat and skirt, and tan
oxford shoes. She recently had all
of her teeth extracted and was
awaiting a denture.

She was a member of the Salva-
tion Army Corps at Haliburton and
Mr. Robertson says this organiza-
tion are conducting a search for her
in Toronto.

Meanwhile the search for her
whereabouts is being continued by
her husband.
