**SOLDIER BEING TRIED ON  
DANGEROUS DRIVING  
CHARGE AT WHITBY**

The trial of Pte. Ralph Sedore, on  
a charge of dangerous driving  
arising from an accident which  
happened in Brooklin at the inter-  
section of Highways 12 and 7 on  
October 3 last, began last week in  
Whitby Court House before Judge  
J. C. M. German. In the accident  
Garth Bailey of Brooklin was killed  
and Norman Schell and Cpl. W. H.  
Gallinger suffered broken legs.  
Pte. Sedore was committed for  
trial after a preliminary hearing in  
Oshawa on March 28. He elected  
trial before a judge. The trial was  
delayed because two of the main  
witnesses had been seriously in-  
jured and were in hospital until  
recently.  
The accident occurred when Pte.  
Sedore, driving an army vehicle in  
a convoy, failed to stop at the inter-  
section and collided with a milk  
truck driven by L. B. Blakely.  
Those who gave evidence were  
Dr. W. W. Baldwin, L.B. Blakely,  
Norman Schell, 14, his father Wes-  
ley Schell, Nancy Townsend, 10,  
and Evelyn Ormiston and Pro-  
vincial Constable Robert France.

**OATS EXPORTS ARE  
APPROVED ON CONDITION**

Sale of five million bushels of  
oats for export has been authorized,  
provided sales are made to UNRRA  
through the Department of Trade  
and Commerce, the Canadian  
Wheat Board announces

Sales require export permits, the  
fee for which is subject to daily  
change in accordance with fluctua-  
tions in prices for oats on the Chi-  
cago market. It is understood that  
firms which have accumulated and  
carried oats in storage will be  
allowed to recover their carrying  
costs.

Holders of barley will presum-  
ably be in a different position. The  
feeds administrator has ordered  
that all barley in store at or in  
transit to the head of the lakes is  
to be offered for sale to him unless  
it has already been sold to a Cana-  
dian buyer. Some five million  
bushels of barley are understood to  
be affected, which have been car-  
ried in store on behalf of American  
interest. The latter, it is said, have  
paid malting premiums and carry-  
ing charges, in the hope of ultimate-  
ly being able to get permits to  
export it to the United States.
