This year the committee has purchased an additional 250 acres of land. They have been given an appropriation of \$10,-000 to carry on their work. These forest trees in Whit-

are estimated to be 20 years old. The open space runs across the forest and is one of numerous avenues known as 'fire guards'. Every fourth row of trees this size is due for removal as a thinning process. The small poles made from the fallen trees are cut into pit props, shipped to England, and are used for shoring purposes in the coal mines of England. Thick planting ensures trees growing tall and straight.


