



It may be just a coincidence that the reeve of Stouffville and the deputy reeve of Whitchurch are both members of the York County Reforestation Committee, or they may have been placed there because of their close proximity to the undertaking centred around Vivian in the Township of Whitchurch. Also on this committee is Jos. Spillette, prominent business man of Newmarket, Frank Burkholder of Markham, J. D. Sibbald of Geor-

gina township, W. S. Taylor from North York township and W. R. Scott, reeve of Woodbridge. The reeve of Stouffville is chairman of the group, and following the report submitted by his committee to county council the Evening Telegram published a half page of pictures illustrating the high points of the report by photos taken right on the property. Here is shown Deputy Reeve Logan sifting blow sand thro-



ugh his fingers, showing how "shiftless" this kind of soil can be. Tree planting seals this soil down, also conserves the winter snows better than vacant land that contributes to spring floods. This year the committee has purchased an additional 250 acres of land. They have been given an appropriation of \$10,000 to carry on their work. These forest trees in Whitchurch shown in this picture

are estimated to be 20 years old. The open space runs across the forest and is one of numerous avenues known as 'fire guards'. Every fourth row of trees this size is due for removal as a thinning process. The small poles made from the fallen trees are cut into pit props, shipped to England, and are used for shoring purposes in the coal mines of England. Thick planting ensures trees growing tall and straight.

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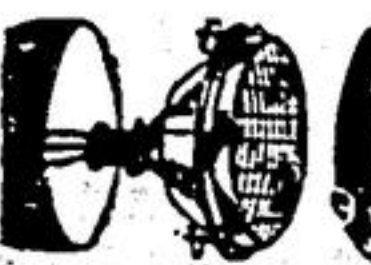
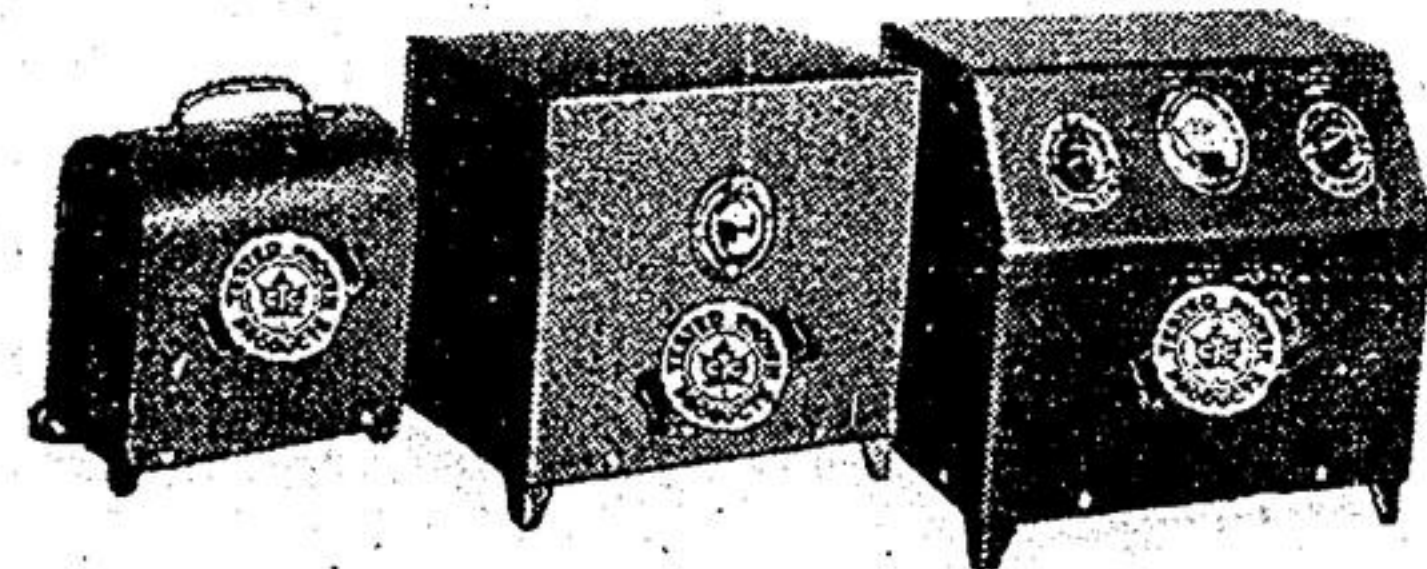
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
