A .- Meat coupons M40 to M50 expire Saturday, Aug. 31st. Butter coupons R10 to R17 expfre at the same time. The expiry dates for canning sugar coupons have not been announced. In former years these coupons have remained valid until December 31 and no doubt they will remain valid until this date again this year.
