Although called natural gas, the new product is not the gas that comes from underground sources, and used and referred to in many parts of Canada as natural gas. The fuel is liquid and is, therefore. sometimes referred to as "bottled 2 Heaters gas." .This liquid vaporizes on com-Kitchen Range ing in contact with air, somewhat Lawn Mower as gasoline and air put through a Dinner Bell carburetor are converted into the vapor fuel for an automobile.

The fuel comes in cylinders that are inserted in a tank located outside the house of the consumer. From this tank it is piped into the house much as the Consumers' Gas Co. of Toronto pipes its product
