THE MIXING BOWL

Hello, Homemakers! When the sun sets low over the garden and there is that azure-blue haze—it's September. Summer is making her exit..... time to garner late fruits. It is also time to prepare for frosty nights. The following hints about fall duties are apt to go unheeded—but the neighbors told me so.
Small quantities of root crops, such as beets, carrots, turnips and salsify should be stored in a root cellar or dark basement in moist sand, either in piles or in boxes. If you put in alternate layers of vegetables and sand, the roots will not shrivel. When they are gathered, the tops should be cut off.
Cabbages may be wrapped in newspaper and stored in a dry box. Green tomatoes should be wrapped in two thicknesses of paper and put in shallow boxes.

Proper ventilation of the storage room is essential. A window should be contructed for easy adjustment during very cold weather.

RECIPES

Onions au gratin

Green onions, stems and all, are washed, split and trimmed of bulb skin. Boil them in very little water; serve on toast with a thick white sauce. Sprinkle with grated cheese.
Veal with Green Peppers

Dip veal cutlets in milk, then in flour to which salt and pepper has been added. Brown in a little fat in hot frying pan. Remove to casserole; add 2 cups diced tomatoes, ½ cup broken spaghetti, cover with trimmed scalded green pepper sections. Bake in electric oven of 350 degs. for 40 mins.

Sautéed Summer Squash

Pare summer squash and cut into slices about an inch thick. Dust pieces with salt, pepper and a pinch of mustard, dip in beaten egg, then in fine crumbs, and brown in a greased frying pan. Turn and cover; let cook 12 mins.

Chicken Burger Sauce

Heat together ¼ cup fresh catsup, 1 tbsp. vinegar, 1 tsp. small chives or minced onion, dash of chili powder, few grains cayenne, 2 tsps. Worcestershire sauce, salt to taste. Serve with diced chicken between split buns.

PLUM WHIP

1 tbsp. plain gelatine, ¼ cup plum juice, 1 cup cooked plum pulp, 2 tsps. brown sugar, 2 egg whites, (beaten stiffly), 2 tsps. cold water, ¼ cup sugar, ¼ tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. cinnamon, 2 tsps. lemon juice.

Soak the gelatine in the cold water for five minutes. Add it to the hot plum juice, sugar and salt and stir until dissolved. Add the plums which have been mashed and mixed with the brown sugar, cinnamon and lemon juice. Chill until partly thickened, then fold in the beaten egg whites. Pour into a mould, chill until firm, then unmould and serve with cream. Five to six servings.

BLUEBERRY UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE

1½ cups blueberries, one-third cup brown sugar, ¼ tsp. cloves, 1 tbsp. butter, ¼ cup water, ¼ cup shortening, ¼ cup milk, ½ tsp. vanilla, ½ cup sugar, 1 beaten egg, ¼ cup enriched flour, ¼ tsp. salt, 1½ tsps. baking powder.

Combine blueberries, one-third cup of brown sugar, cloves, butter and water. Simmer 5 mins. Pour into greased 8-inch square cake pan. Thoroughly cream shortening, vanilla, and ½ cup granulated sugar. Add egg and beat well. Sift flour, salt, and baking powder; add alternately with milk. This is a heavy batter. Spoon over berries; spread evenly. Bake in moderate electric oven (350 degrees) 40 mins.

PEACH PARFAIT

Pudding: Beat 2 egg yolks, 1 whole egg, and ¼ cup sugar until lemon coloured. Gradually stir in 2 cups scalded milk. Cook in double boiler, stirring constantly until mix-

**Polish Workmen
for Local Farms**

According to a statement issued by B. C. Sullivan, Ontario Regional Superintendent of National Employment Service, many farmers in this region will soon have the opportunity of applying for sorely needed farm help from among the four thousand Polish War Veterans who will arrive in this country during September and October.
It is understood that the Polish Veterans, now in Italy, are being "screened" by representatives of the Dominion Department Agriculture to their suitability for work on Canadian Farms. The statement mentioned that between fifteen hundred and two thousand of these Veterans will be placed in farm employment in Ontario. It was emphasized in Mr. Sullivan's remarks that only single men are being interviewed, preferably with previous farm experience. In each case the applicant must be under thirty-five years of age.

In further commenting on the recruiting of Polish Veterans to work on the farm, Mr. Sullivan stated, "With the arrival of these men from Europe, Canadian Farmers will be in a position to augment their present labour help by applying to any local office of the National Employment Service. In this respect, farmers who undertake to employ a Polish Veteran will be required to contract for at least one year's continuous employment."
"It is planned," continued Mr. Sullivan, "to properly equip each Polish Farm applicant with suitable work clothes. This will be completed before arrival at his ultimate destination. Placement will be made by the National Employment Officers in co-operation with the Provincial Farm Labour Committee."

It has just been announced from Ottawa that 700 Polish War Veterans will arrive in Ontario this month.

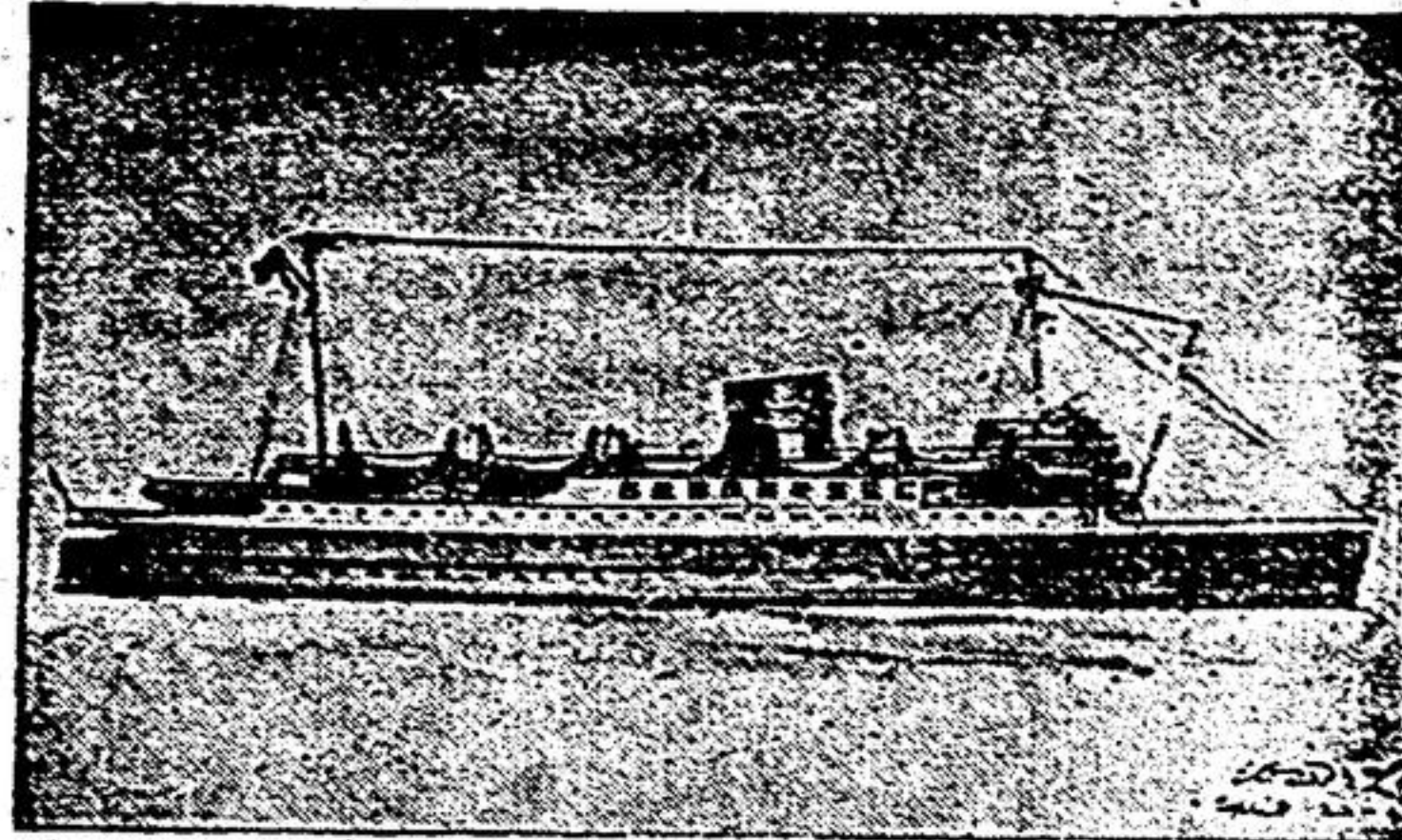
VALUABLE PRINT

DISCOVERED ON RESERVATION



An original Currier and Ives print, "Hiawatha's Wedding," has been recently found on the Six Nations Indians reservation at Brantford, Ontario. The print has the original stamp, and the finder, Mrs. Hugh Martin, claims it to be one of the rarer prints. Currier and Ives prints, circa 1858, originally cost only a few cents, but today are valuable collectors' items.

NEW ALL-CANADIAN STEAMSHIP FOR PACIFIC COAST



Above is the naval architect's drawing of the 5000-ton steamship which will be built for the Pacific Coast and Alaska service of the Canadian National Pacific Coast Steamships by the Burrard Dry Dock Co. Ltd. of Vancouver. The ship, the largest passenger vessel ever to be built on the Pacific Coast, will coast about \$3,000,000 and should enter service in 1948. Plans of McLaren and Son, consulting engineers and naval architects, call for a vessel with and over-all length of 350 feet, a breadth of 52 feet, a displacement tonnage of 5,000 tons and a speed of 18 knots. The ship will have accommodation for 322 passengers, all in outside cabins, and 50,000 cubic feet of cargo space, of which 5,000 will be refrigerated. Besides giving important passenger and cargo service, all year round to Vancouver, Powell River, Ocean Falls and Prince Rupert, the steamship will provide Alaska cruises for thousands of summer tourists. The crew will consist of 20 officers and 112 men.
