THE MIXING BOWL

Hydro Home Economist

There are numerous ways home-makers can save electricity. By employing each and every means of conservation we shall keep every home appliance and industrial machine in operation.

Home Lighting

1. Reduce the number of lamps burning in a room which is in use to the minimum necessary for good vision.

2. Do not burn lamps in unused rooms; do not forget to turn out the attic, basement, garage lamps and outdoor lighting.

3. Keep lamp shades and fixtures clean; dirty fixtures absorb as much as one quarter of the light.

Electric Range

1. Use kettles which fit the electric element so that the entire cooking surface is heated quickly.

2. Cook all vegetables in a small amount of rapidly boiling water. When the vegetable is added cover with a tight fitting lid and turn the element from high to medium or low.

3. When you roast meat, plan an oven dinner which can be cooked at the same time.

4. Use your pressure cooker if you can.

Refrigerator

1. Defrost refrigerator regularly every week or ten days.

2. When storing food, or prearing means make one "loading" or "unloading" do.

3. Do not use the refrigerator to store foods which should be in the pantry. Take out jams, pickles and canned foods.

4. Be sure and cool heated foods before putting them in the refrigerator.

Water Heating

1. Use hot water sparingly when bathing, doing dishes or laundry; do not use running hot water.

2. Do not leave hot water taps dripping; replace worn-out washers.

Washing Machines

1. Soak soiled clothes in cold water.

2. Fill washing machine with hot water only to the water line.

3. Use warm water for only one rinse; a second and third rinse can be made in cold water.

Other Appliances

1. Do not leave the radio on if not in use.

2. Turn iron off before the ironing is completed

Pressure Cooker Meat Loaf

1 1/2 lbs. round steak, 1/2 lb. sausage meat, 2 eggs beaten, 2tbsps. chili sauce, 1 tsp. salt, 1 onion, 2 carrots, 1 stalk celery, 1/2 cup bread crumbs and 1 tbsp. fat.

Grind meat twice. Add eggs and chili sauce and salt. Chop onion, carrots and celery and add along with crumbs. Heat fat in cooker and having formed meat into a mould, brown it for 2 mins. Add 3 tbsps. water. Cook 15 minutes at pressure.

Fuel-saving Oven Meal

Fish Souffle; browned potatoes, beans au gratin and meringue cake. Servings for 5. Temperature, 325 d. Time, 1 hour, 15 mins.

Time-Saving Oven Meal

3 lbs. Roast Beef; Spaghetti with Tomatoes, Baked Potatoes and Coconut Apple Betty. Servings for 6. Time: 1 hour, 40 mins. Temperature: 350 degs.

Triplicate Saucepan Set

Bolled Potatoes, Mashed Turnips and Fruit Dumplings with cold meat for entree.

Vegetable Growers Association, annual meeting, January 22, King Edward Hotel.

Crop Improvement Association, potato section, annual meeting, February 10, King Edward Hotel.

Crop Improvement Association, convention, February 11 and 12, King Edward Hotel.

Ontario Plowmen's Association, annual meeting, February 11, King Edward Hotel.

Class "B" Fairs Association, annual meeting, February 12, King Edward Hotel.

Association of Agricultural Societies, convention, February 13, and 14, King Edward Hotel.

In conjunction with these meetings there will be a seed display by the Crop Improvement Association, a handicrafts display by the Women's Division of the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies and an exhibit by the Extension Branch of the Federal Department of Agriculture at the King Edward Hotel, all of these to be on display from February 10 to 14.

The annual meetings and conventions of the organizations of live stock breeders are scheduled to be held at the Royal York Hotel, Toronto during the week of February 3, with meetings each day from Monday to Friday, inclusive.

The Ontario Horticultural Association will hold its annual convention at the General Brock Hotel, Niagara Falls, on March 6 and 7. This convention, formerly held in Toronto, was transferred to Niagara on account of hotel accommodation.

DEPORTED INDIAN SAYS BRITISH BARRED HIM FROM CANADA

British influences which objected to his views on Indian independence and British control in India were blamed by Maganlal Hirachand Shah, an elected member of the Bombay legislature and an automo-

tive engineer by trade for a deportation, order which barred his entry to Canada. The incident is being investigated. He is a member of the Congress Party, led by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, which now leads in the effort to set up an interim Indian government, and was imprisoned with Nehru by the British from 1942 to 1945. Reason for his visit to Canada, he says, was to study automotive production and to seek special schooling for a niece. He is now in Detroit.
