There are numerous ways homemakers can save electricity. By emyloping each and every means of conservation we shall keep every home appliance and industrial mach ine in operation.

Home Lighting 1. Reduce the number of lamps burning in a room which is in use to the minimum necessary for good vision.

2. Do not burn lamps in unused rooms; do not forget to turn out the attic, basement, garage lamps and outdoor lighting.

3. Keep lamp shades and fixtures clean; dirty fixtures absorb as much at one quarter of the light. Electric Range

1. Use kettles which fit the electric element so that the entire cooking surface is heated quickly.

2. Cook all vegetables in a small amount of rapidly boiling water. When the vegetable is added cover with a tight fitting lid and turn the element from high to medium or

1. Defrost refrigerator regularly

erator. Water Heating Use hot water sparingly when bathing, doing dishes or laundry;

Washing Machines 1. Soak soiled clothes in cold

water. 2. Fill washing machine with hot

water only to the water line. 3. Use warm water for only one rinse; a second and third rinse can be made in cold water.

Other Appliances 1. Do not leave the radio on if not in use.




