W.P.T.B. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q.—I have a man, his wife and little girl living in three rooms in my home. We all use the same entrance and the same bath-room. This couple fight every night and as my wife is not in good health she cannot stand the noise. Do I have to give them six month's notice or not?
 A.—From the information contained in your letter we would say you did not have to give them six months' notice. However, you will have to appear in the Rentals Court and explain the situation to the officials in charge. Your tenants will also have an opportunity to tell their side of the story. The person in charge of the hearing will determine whether or not these people are "obnoxious" tenants. If so you will be able to give them notice to move. As you live in Hamilton we suggest you call at the Board office in that city..... 36 James Street. South. We cannot give you any further information in the column and are unable to write a personal letter as you did not give us your name or address.

Q.—Last week I wanted to buy some Swiss type Gruyere cheese and was told it was \$1.20 a lb. I do not know whether cheese prices are under a price ceiling or not but pass this information to you for whatever action you may deem fit.
 A.—Cheddar cheese, processed cheese, cream cheese and cottage cheese are still under ceiling price regulations. This Swiss cheese is not and therefore the dealer could set his own price.

Q.—I read in this column that preserves were no longer rationed yet my grocer took a sugar coupon for a jar of jam. Which is correct?
 A.—Canned-fruit has been removed from the list of rationed items but jam, jelly, marmalade, maple syrup, honey, etc. are still rationed so your grocer was quite right when he took the coupon.

Q.—Is there still a ceiling price on shoes? Just before Christmas I paid \$19 for a pair and I am sure I never paid such a price before.
 A.—There certainly is a ceiling price on shoes. As you gave us the name of the store where you bought those shoes and all the details about them we checked into the matter and find that they were imported from the U.S. Shoe prices have increased in that country and naturally the increase must be passed along to the customer.

Sold Turkeys Over Ceiling

"Even though it might work a hardship on the storekeeper, ungraded poultry can't be sold at anything other than Grade B price," Magistrate F. S. Ebbs commented in fining Ross Murison, Ajax, \$10 and costs or ten days on a charge of violating WPTB regulations in police court at Whitby last week.

"He made a guess and he was wrong," said the Magistrate, declaring that the accused was technically guilty of the offence and subject to a nominal fine.

According to testimony of Jack Aldwinckle and A. J. Thompson, Prices Board investigators, the accused offered turkey for sale six cents over the ceiling for ungraded poultry on December 18 last. "There was no mark of any description on that turkey," said Mr. Thompson, referring to the bird purchased by Mr. Aldwinckle in the accused's store at Ajax.

Mr. Murison told the court he had bought the turkeys in St. Thomas

after efforts to secure a supply for Christmas from Canada Packers had failed. "They were bought as special grade turkeys," Mr. Murison testified.

Labelling the whole charge "a tempest in a tea-pot," R. D. Humphreys, K.C., counsel for the accused, said the Crown, represented by A. F. Annis, K.C., had failed to make allowance for freight charges or transportation costs of any description in arriving at the proper price. "The accused actually sold the birds at a loss," said Mr. Humphreys.

"There should be better arrangements made for storekeepers in connection with grading," said Magistrate Ebbs. "This man tried to have the birds graded in the district but was unable to do so. The moral seems to be: don't handle turkeys," concluded the Magistrate. "You might as well go out of business. Don't handle anything," commented Mr. Humphreys sharply.

PERSONALITY SKETCHES

(Canadian Health, Welfare)
Burness W. Heise, O.B.E., deputy minister of public welfare for Ontario, was born at Stouffville, and received his education at Stouffville, Markham and Toronto, graduating from the School of Social Work, University of Toronto, in 1925.

From 1923 to 1926 Mr. Heise was affiliated with the Big Brother Movement of Toronto, latterly as field secretary. In the fall of 1926 he joined the staff of the Children's Aid Society of Buffalo and Erie County, where he remained until the spring of 1930. While in Buffalo he was a member of the health group of the Buffalo Council of Social Agencies and a member of the American Association of Social Workers, holding the office of vice-president and chairman of the membership committee of the Buffalo Chapter.

In 1930 he was appointed managing director of the Children's Aid Society of Hamilton. From 1931 to 1934 he was a member of the executive committee of the Hamilton Council of Social Agencies. In 1934 Mr. Heise joined the Provincial Department of Public Welfare as field supervisor of the Children's Aid Branch. In 1935 he was promoted to the position of provincial superintendent, Children's Aid Branch, and in 1944 became deputy minister of the Department.

Mr. Heise has at various times been a member of the executive committee and chairman of divisions of the Canadian Welfare Conference. In 1940 he was a member

of the Dominion-Provincial Committee on British Child Guests and has acted as guardian for the British children placed in Ontario from the time of their arrival in that province. From 1942, Mr. Heise served as provincial representative on the local advisory committees of the Dependents Board of Trustees in Ontario and was vice-chairman of the provincial advisory committee for Wartime Day Nurseries.

From 1941 to 1945 he was a member of the Council of the School of Social Work, University of Toronto. Mr. Heise is a member of the board of the Canadian Welfare Council and chairman of the Public Welfare Committee, a member of the Canadian Association of Social Workers, having served as chairman of the national membership committee from 1932 to 1934 and national president from 1934 to 1938.

Mr. Heise is a recipient of the King George V Silver Jubilee Medal, the King George VI Coronation Medal and in 1946 was honored by the award of the O.B.E.
