Uxbridge Has Second Snowplow on Order

There were a number of complaints received at Monday's meeting of Uxbridge township council regarding the lack of snowplowing. The Township has a second plow unit on order, in fact has had on order since last July, and until this equipment is delivered some delays are impossible to avoid.

Council passed the annual bylaw appointing officials, and another bylaw to authorize the reeve and the treasurer to borrow money when needed. Standing committees were named and a Park Board consisting of Mr. J. F. Reid, Dr. Darling, Johnson Kidd, J. Ashenbush and Mrs. Howard Harper for 1947-48, and Stuart Ball and Berton Tindall for 1947. John Ashenbush was appointed Relief Administrator for the current year. The council renewed its membership in the Ontario Good Roads Association, and ordered eight copies of the "Municipal World" for use of the members of council and officials.

Road accounts for December amounting to \$428.73 were passed for payment, and general accounts for \$274.30.

The next meeting will be held in the afternoon of Feb. 10th.
