W.P.T.B. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q.—I am the unlucky owner of a house which I bought last year after my return from overseas. I have a wife and family and invested all my savings in this house. I intend to get my home this summer by any means. This man never left Canada and he can still remain in my home. What can I do?

A.—Frankly there is very little you can do. The present regulations were in effect when you purchased this house and you were quite aware that you would be unable to give the tenants notice. You must remember that there are many veterans in rented accommodation who would be without homes if this order was changed at the present time. It is never a good idea to take the law in your own hands and if you plan to do this naturally you must be prepared to suffer

the consequences.

Q.—The enclosed wrapping is from a half pound package of tea which bears a price of 40c. The tea was sold for 45c. I know the price of tea has gone up but I was under the impression that the new price would be marked on the package. Am I right?

A.—The price of tea was increased 10c per lb. The correct price for the tea you bought is 45c for a half a lb. and it would seem that the manufacturers are still using their old packages. Many manufacturers and retailers have large supplies of such packages and with the serious shortage of paper it would be very wasteful to throw them away. However, it would seem to be a better idea to write the new price on the package to save confusion.

Q.—I am a regular customer at a butcher shop and last weekend I paid \$2 for a three lb. rolled rib roast, and 42c for a half a lb. of bacon. Are these prices right?

A.—It is difficult to give the exact ceiling price without knowing the grade of meat you purchased. We can tell you however, that the ceiling price for prime red beef, best quality, is 53c a lb. and for the best quality fancy side bacon in packages is 65c a lb. The price you paid would certainly seem to be over the ceiling and as you gave us the name and address of the butcher we will have his prices checked at once.

Q.—Please explain what steps should be taken when applying

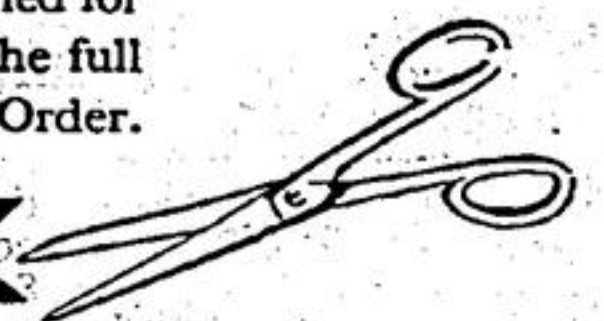
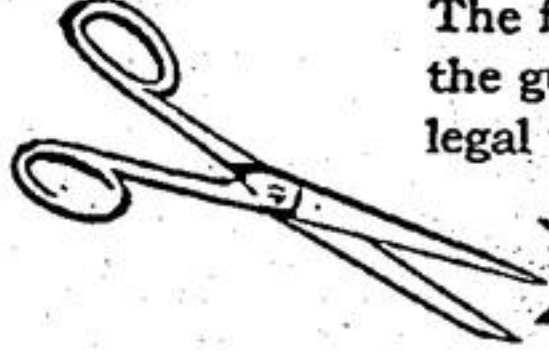

IMPORTANT GOVERNMENT NOTICE Respecting Price Control

The following is a convenient summary of Board Order No. 711—published for the guidance and protection of Canadian consumers. It does not give the full legal text. For full details of the law reference should be made to the Order.

Summary of GOODS AND SERVICES REMAINING SUBJECT TO MAXIMUM PRICE REGULATIONS

As set forth in Wartime Prices & Trade Board Order No. 711—effective April 2, 1947
