**BIBLE QUESTIONS and ANSWERS**

Question—Who were the Gentiles often mentioned in the Bible?

Answer—The word "Gentiles" simply means the people or nations. Israel was God's peculiar people, His chosen nation. (Exodus 19:5; Isaiah 43:20.) The Gentiles were all other nations and peoples.

Q.—Is the atom bomb mentioned in the Scriptures?

A.—No, but the description of events in the "day of the Lord" is suggestive. "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up." 2 Peter 3:10.

Q.—If I always love my neighbor and am honest, will I not get to heaven?

A.—Listen to this: "Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself." Matthew 22:37-39. A good many people are apt to overlook the first and great commandment. Our duty is first to God—then to man.

Q.—Are all prayers heard?

A.—All sincere prayers are heard by God, but not all are answered in exactly the way we wish or expect. God sometimes says, No. Sometimes He gives what we ask; sometimes He gives us something better. Our Saviour said: "Men ought always to pray, and not to faint." Luke 18:1. Also in Matthew 7:7-11: "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: for every one that asketh receiveth; and he that knocketh it shall be opened. Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone? Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent? If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask Him?" Read also Psalm 65:2.

**FORD LIES AT REST ON FARM OF BIRTH**

Detroit, April 11—Henry Ford lay buried today beneath a sycamore tree that shaded his childhood days on the farm where he was born.

Hard by his simple plot of fresh-dug earth, the vast River Rouge plant of the Ford Motor Company roared to life at midnight, its thundering assembly lines an impressive tribute to his name.

It had been closed since midnight Wednesday out of respect to his death Monday at the age of 83.

One of the world's richest men, Ford's funeral services Thursday were described by his Episcopal Church as "intended for prince or pauper alike."

Thousands of persons stood in reverent silence beneath leaden skies outside St. Paul's Cathedral during the ceremony.

Police said the crowd numbered 7,000 to 10,000.

**Made 2,600 Acres Pay on Co-op Farm in West 15 Veterans to Expand**

Plan Add Two More Partners and Break 3,000 More Acres — Start Community

Regina, April 12—Fifteen veterans who pooled their labor and resources to farm the wheatlands of Saskatchewan are expanding their incorporated operations this spring. They plan to add two new members to their co-operative group, break another 4,000 acres and build more homes in the tightly-knit community.

The veterans, whose average age is in the mid 20's, reaped a good crop of flax sown on 300 of the 2,600 acres they broke last year. That was the beginning of the experimental project Matador, situated on former ranch lands 40 miles north of Swift Current, on the edge of the dry southwest corner of Saskatchewan.

**Livestock Next**

Early next month they intend to seed 1,800 acres of wheat and 800 acres of flax, concentrating on grain farming until well established. Future projects, however, include livestock and poultry.

Though the men still hope for a reversal of Federal Legislation now ruling out veteran's land to co-operative farmers, they have been able to buy outright the four tractors, two trucks and a jeep loaned by the C.C.F. provincial government along with cash.

They also plan to enlarge the community buildings which now include four bungalows housing the four married men and their families, a dormitory for single men, a barn and a machine shop.

The community kitchen has been abandoned by the families who now eat in their own homes, but the single men have a common board.

The co-operative was formed last spring following a meeting of 26 veterans and agricultural experts called together by the provincial government.

The farm is on provincially-owned land held by the group on a 33-year lease with option to buy in 10 years.

**Irrigation Plan**

Beside further landscaping of the living area, the group looks forward to completion of an irrigation project, started last year by the Prairie Farm Rehabilitation Administration. It is expected eventually to service 400 acres of the former grazing land.

Co-operative department officials said the best indication yet of success of the experiment is the fact that the men had stuck together through what has been described as the worst winter in western history.

**TRACTOR CRUSHES CHATHAM FARMER**

Mike Bota, 48-year-old farmer of Raleigh Township, near Chatham, was killed by his new farm tractor. He was found dead at the bottom of a three-foot ditch with the right rear-wheel of the machine on his back. Coroner Dr. F. W. Hall, who decided an inquest was unnecessary, said the unfortunate man died of a crushed chest.

The accident occurred on the Drake Rd., about two miles from No. 2 Highway. Sam Lecocq of Fletcher, driving north, noticed the man and machine in the ditch. He summoned help, but the victim was

dead. Provincial Constable Jack Bain, who was called to the scene, said Bota was lying face downward with the big wheel on his back. Marks on the road would indicate that Bota had been driving north, too close to the ditch, and that the tractor slipped down the declivity.
