SKY ROCKETS NOT FOR SALE ON MAY 24

OTTAWA, April 21—Canadian planning fireworks celebration on May 24 won't be able to get those sky-streaking rockets. Their sale is banned now as a safety measure.

Mines and Resources Minister Glen reminded Canadians of this regulations promulgated last December which removed rockets from the list of fireworks that may be sold as "shop goods."

The prohibition resulted from previous House of Commons discussions when members urged the rockets be withheld from sale to juveniles.

38 DEER YARDED NEAR BOBCAYGEON

A large herd of deer which were yarded all last winter about three miles out of Bobcaygeon, just off the main highway, are still there. A couple of days ago a group of people went down to see if they were showing signs of moving off and counted 38 in the herd. However, this is not necessarily an accurate check on the number in the herd because bushes conceal many from view.

Deer when yarded are reported to become fairly tame and by moving quietly it is said one can get within a comparatively short distance of them. Scores of people have visited this particular "yard" on numerous occasions throughout the winter and early spring and report it to be a sight worth seeing.

"I'M GOOD PAYING GUEST"



British-born comedian, Charlie Chaplin, at a press conference for foreign newspaper men, answered questions asked by New York columnist Ed Sullivan. Sullivan wrote: "For 30 years Chaplin has earned a lush living in the U.S., abandoning his native land England. Why hasn't Chaplin become an American citizen?" "I haven't become an American citizen," said Chaplin, "because I am not a nationalist. Seventy per cent. of my income is derived from Europe, and 30 per cent. from the U.S. The U.S. takes 100 per cent. of that income for taxation purposes. I am a very good paying guest." "Does Chaplin prefer democracy as defined by Russian communism to democracy as it is defined in the United States?" wrote Sullivan. To which Chaplin replied: "I'm not touting for any ideology. I'm for the progress of the human race. I'm for the little man."

1000 Chicks Die in Fire at Aurora

Loss Around \$1,500 When Brooder House Razed Before Aid Arrived
Over 1,000 newly-hatched chicks were lost when a brooder house on the small farm of John Ivanitsky, near the CFRB radio transmission station, south of Aurora, was destroyed by fire Thursday night.
Ivanitsky noticed a glow in the brooder house and found the inside of the building in flames. Aurora Fire Brigade under Chief Harry Jones rushed to the scene but the building was almost destroyed when they arrived.
Damage was estimated as in the vicinity of \$1,500. Ivanitsky lost a leg in a mining accident a number of years ago.

MUSKRAT STEAKS MENU FEATURES AT LEAMINGTON

Leamington, April 14 — For 30 days every spring, residents of Leamington with time on their hands, turn to the profitable endeavor of trapping muskrats. The traps are found chiefly in the marshes around Leamington and Point Pelee National Park. So far over 8,000 have been taken from the Park this year.

Many trappers pay their five-dollar license fee and place as many as 100 traps. Top catch reported to date is said to be 50 muskrats in a single night. Each skin can be marketed in Toronto for \$2.25, but it seems that it is not only the skins which are in heavy demand this year.

The most popular item on the bill of fare at spring banquets being held in Leamington has been muskrat! Almost every civic organization in the town holds one big dinner each spring, and this year muskrat has been featured.
According to experts, the skinned muskrat, weighing slightly more than a pound, is dropped into a large pot where it simmers for about two hours along with 50 of his fellow species. The thick brew consists of onions, gravy, bits of chopped vegetables. Then the muskrats are removed singly, fried lightly in butter for 30 minutes then served. And that's it! They say it's good.

W.P.T.B. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q.—I live in an apartment (self contained) and pay \$25 a month. What should I do when I pay my rent again and he does not mention raising the rent? I have no objection to paying the increase. Should I mention it to him? As long as I know he cannot put me out I will not worry.

A.—Many people are worried about rental problems these days. Your landlord has the privilege of offering you a two year lease with a 10% increase in rent. If he does not want to do this he cannot increase your rent or give you notice to vacate while the "freezing order" remains in effect. Whether or not you mention this matter to the landlord is something you must decide. Stop worrying—go to your nearest W.P.T.B. rental office and obtain all the information you require.

Q.—Will you kindly tell me if the control has been taken off tobacco? I have been paying \$4c (which includes 14% tax). Now the amount in the container is reduced.

A.—Tobacco was removed from price ceiling regulations more than a year ago so you see each dealer may set his own price. The matter of tax comes within the jurisdiction of the Department of National Revenue and if you feel you are being charged an incorrect amount of tax report the matter to that Department.

Q.—I want to start my own business. Do I need a Prices Board License?

A.—We cannot tell you as you do not state the type of business you plan to open. If the merchandise you want to sell is still under price ceiling regulations you still require a license. If the merchandise has been removed from controls a license is not necessary.

Q.—Could you give me the ceiling price I could charge for altering women's clothes, making women's and children's clothes etc.?

A.—There is no ceiling price on this type of work. It would be impossible to set a maximum ceiling price on work which depends entirely on individual skill and ability. Many dress-makers are very experienced and others can certainly be considered amateurs so it would not be fair to quote the same price for their work. You can get ahead and set your own prices.

Q.—The Women's Association of our church is holding a luncheon for some 325 people on April 22. Would it be possible to get sugar and butter coupons for this purpose?

A.—No extra sugar and coupons are not issued for this purpose. If the church
