

Dairy Cattle and Hogs Are Shipped to China

A shipment of 797 head of Canadian dairy cattle—637 Holstein, Ayrshire and Jersey heifers in calf and 160 pure bred bulls; also 90 Yorkshire hogs, 75 sows and 15 pure bred boars, left Vancouver on April 12 aboard the SS. Lindenwood Victory for Shanghai, China. This shipment may prove to be the first of several such shipments in the future.

The consignment of cattle was made up of 637 heifers in calf, 317 of which were Ayrshires, 160 Holsteins and 160 Jerseys. Of the 160 purebred bulls, 80 were Ayrshires, 40 were Holsteins and 40 were Jerseys. The livestock is to be distributed on arrival at Shanghai to Chinese hospitals and agricultural colleges to be asked for breeding purposes. All the boars and sows were bought in Alberta. The cattle were bought in New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Alberta and British Columbia. Of the 317 Ayrshire heifers, 175 came from Quebec, 69 from Ontario, 68 from British Columbia and five from Alberta. Forty-two of the Ayrshire bulls came from Ontario, 10 from Alberta, and 28 from British Columbia.

The Holstein heifer shipment was made up of 130 from Manitoba, 25 from Quebec and five from British Columbia. Of the 40 bulls, 30 were from Ontario, 5 from Quebec, 4 from New Brunswick and 1 from Alberta. Seventy-seven of the 160 Jersey heifers came from British Columbia, 70 from Ontario and 13 from Alberta. British Columbia also provided 30 of the bulls, with eight coming from Ontario and two

from Alberta. All the cattle were tested before being shipped for bovine tuberculosis and blood tested. The hogs also passed rigid tests by Dominion Department of Agricultural veterinarians. Two qualified veterinarians and 34 cattlemen are accompanying the shipment, which is being made by UNRRA. Ten of the cattlemen are university students.

The livestock will evidently be well fed on the 18 to 20 day voyage to Shanghai, as 940 tons of feed in the form of hay and grain are being carried aboard the ship.

Purchase of the livestock was made for UNRRA through the Canadian Commercial Corporation, a Crown Company at a cost of \$231,000 and the selection was made by an officer of the Production Service, Dominion Department of Agriculture.

BEAVERTON MAN'S NOVEL INVENTION BEING PRODUCED

A new automatic window screen, the invention of a Beaverton man, is now in production in an Oshawa factory.

Mr. J.R. Tisdale, manager of the Hotel Hamilton in Beaverton, conceived the idea, and assisted by Mr. D.J. Smith, the automatic screen was perfected. Attached to the bottom of a window, the screen will automatically unwind from a spring roller when the window is lifted and wind up when the window is lowered, the inventor says.

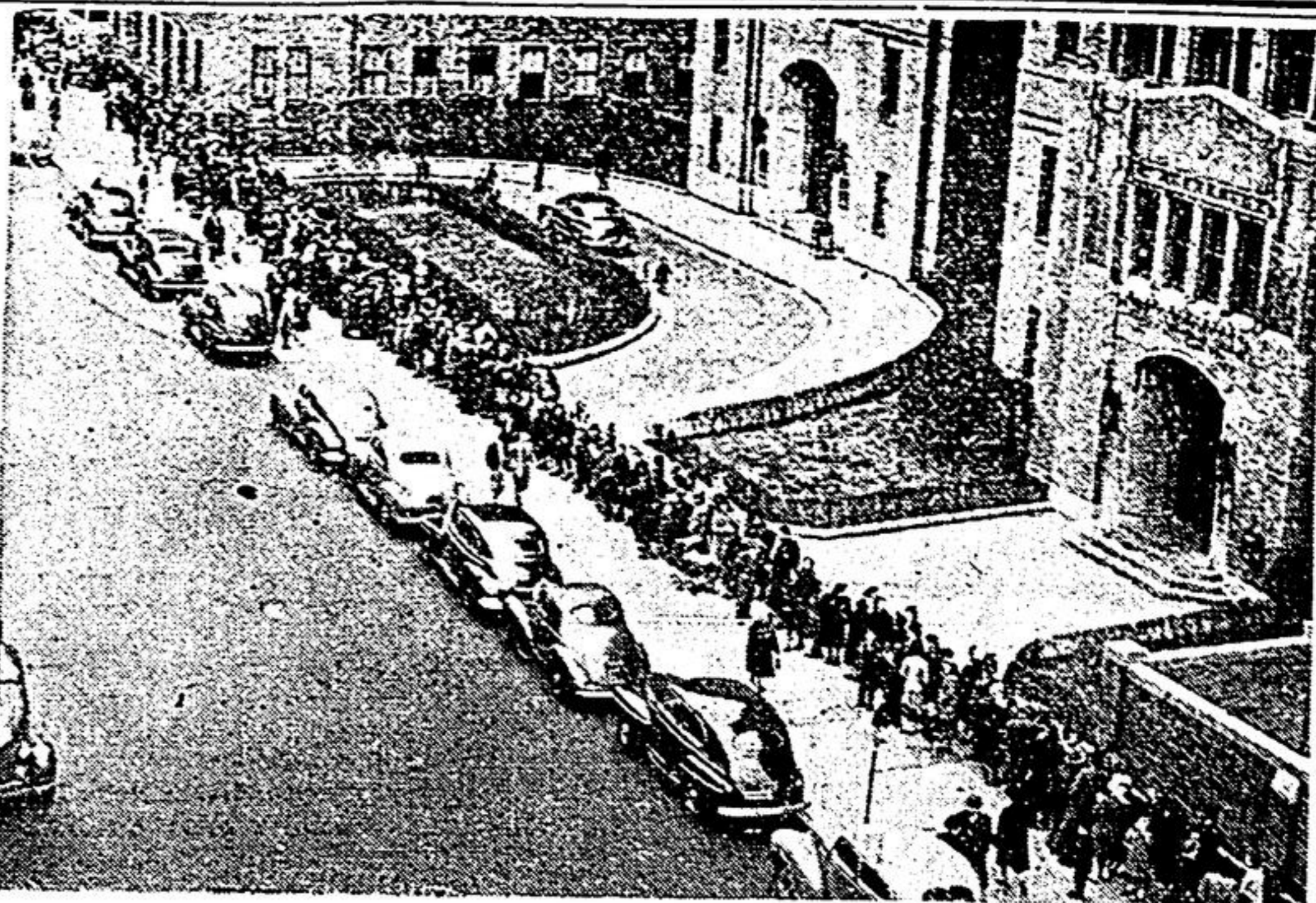

CHINAMAN HUNG AT OAK RIDGES STILL UNIDENTIFIED SATURDAY

Aurora—"The autopsy revealed no foul play as at first suspected but as yet there is no identification of the deceased and as a result no date for an inquest can be set." Coroner Dr. C. J. Devins reported on Tuesday following an autopsy performed the body of a middle-aged Oriental found hanging from a tree at Oak Ridges on Saturday.

On Saturday afternoon at the rear of the Troyer property, seven-year-old Jimmy Peloquin and five-year-old Marlene Peloquin discovered the body dangling from the end of a noose from a tree trunk. Thinking the man was "sleeping standing up," the children reported the matter to their father, Norbert Peloquin, who at first treated the matter as childish imagination. But accompanied by Dennis Story, he went to investigate and then summoned county constable Aubrey Fleury.

Death is believed to have occurred late Friday night or early Saturday as a watch in the pocket of the deceased was still running. He was about six feet in height, weighed around 153 pounds and had in his possession \$4. He was neatly dressed and his shoes were clean and shined. There were no identification papers of any kind and no clues to indicate how the man came to Oak Ridges or reached the semi-secluded spot where he was found. Police are in touch with Toronto Chinese in the hope that identification may eventually be made.
