Frank Welsh, Pefferlaw, died in Toronto General hospital on Tuesday as a result of a traffic accident on Sunday night on the townline between Ontario County and York County. Constable William . Hill Sutton, said that the accident occurred just south of the Sutton-Virginia road, at about 9.30 p.m.

"A car driven by Oscar Parker, 252 Golf St., Oshawa, was proceeding south on the road when the driver saw a jeep coming toward him on the wrong side of the road,' Cons. Hill said. "Parker pulled over to the side of the road and stopped his car. 
