### W.P.T.B. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Typical questions consumers have asked the Wartime Prices and Trade Board this week are answered by the Information Branch.

- Q.—I cannot understand why one store can charge so much more than another when we still have price control? This week I paid 29c. for three tomatoes in one store and bought a pound for the same price in another.
- A.—There is no price ceiling on tomatoes.....each dealer may set his own price. Some of the tomatoes you see on the market today are hot house tomatoes, others are field tomatoes imported from other countries. This makes quite a difference in price. However, the price is not controlled.
- Q.—Have you any booklets left with instructions for remaking clothes?
- A.—Yes, we still have a few and a

copy of the booklet has been sent to you today. There is no charge for this booklet so the money which you enclosed has been returned to you.

- Q.—How much canning sugar will we receive this year?
- A.—Ten extra pounds for canning purposes have been allotted for this year. The first five coupons Y-1 to Y-5 became valid on May 15, and the second five coupons will become valid on July 17. Each coupon is valid for the purchase of one pound of sugar.
- Q.—Could you satisfy an old lady's curiosity? In the scores of letters you receive there must be some very deserving cases. Do you send investigators to find out if all the person is saying is true?
- A.—We are glad to satisfy your curiosity. Every question used in this column was sent in by some interested reader. We

check over their complaints and if they have been overcharged or report some other infraction of Wartime Prices and Trade Board regulations the matter is passed along to the Enforcement Division for investigation. When an investigation has been completed, a written report is sent to the original letter writer. Thanks for your interest..... write in at any time when we may be able to help you.

- Q.—I occupy two rooms in a house.....share the bathroom.....entrance and kitchen facilities with other roomers. Can the landlord raise my rent 10%?
- A.—No..... the 10% increase applies to self contained housing units only.....and then a two year lease must be given if the landlord wishes to take advantage of the increase.

### Oil Situation Could Become Serious

Stouffville, which is said to have more oiling burning home units than any town of similar size in this part of Ontario, according to one prominent dealer, could be seriously affected by the oil situation which looms at this time. Hon. C. D. Howe, Reconstruction Minister, has sent out a warning against the installation of oil burning apparatus.

It was a year ago that there was serious concern about the domestic coal supply due to strikes in the mines and on Great Lake shipping. Additional steel was allocated to manufacturers to produce storage tanks and oil burners and so great has been the demand for these that their numbers are outrunning the prospective reserve of fuel oil. Not only in Central Canada but throughout the northern United States householders have been busily installing oil burners.

Mr. Howe reported to the House of Commons that he has been advised the fuel supply situation for the next heating season is definitely limited and that producers and distributors will not be able to cope with the greatly increased demand. Even if it were possible to provide substantially increased storage facilities it is unlikely that adequate supplies of oil could be imported or produced.

**Companies Responsibility**  
The Government has no control over the production and distribution of fuel oil, Mr. Howe explained. Responsibility for the supply rests wholly on the companies. In his view a householder proposing to install an oil burner should first make sure he has a firm contract for the supply of fuel oil, directly with the manufacturer or importer of fuel oil, or a contract that otherwise clearly insure a supply from these suppliers.

### ATOM ACTIVITY DEFORMS PUMPKIN

Information from Tokyo says that radio activity of the atom bomb dropped on Nagasaki nearly two years ago has brought about double-headed plants, double-bulb onions and deformed pumpkins from more than 20 per cent, of seeds planted in the centre of the blasted area, it was announced.

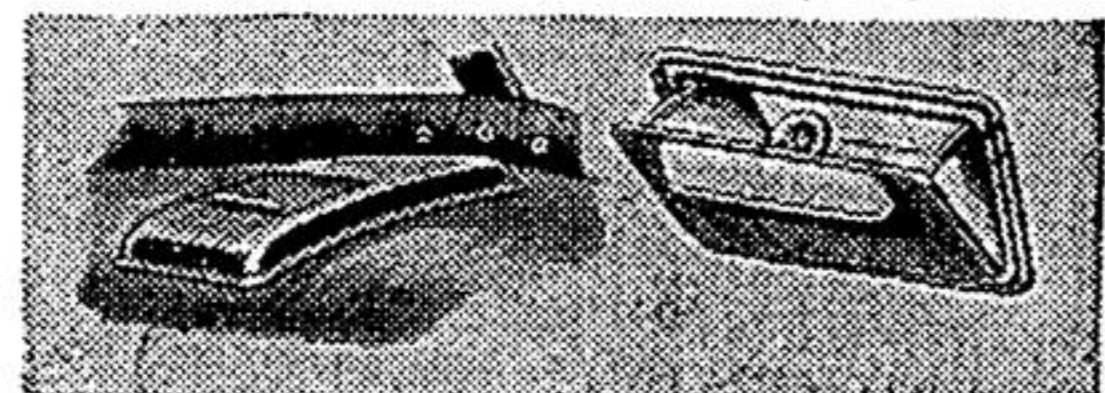
**TOWN OF FOREST VETOES DAYLIGHT TIME BYLAW**

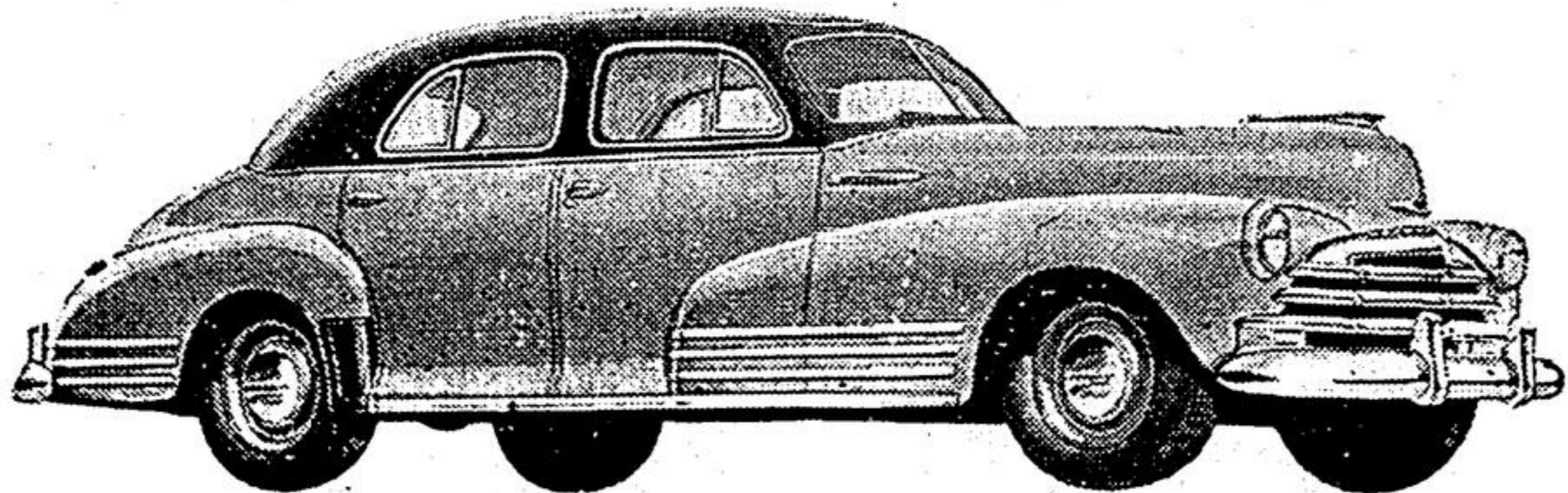
