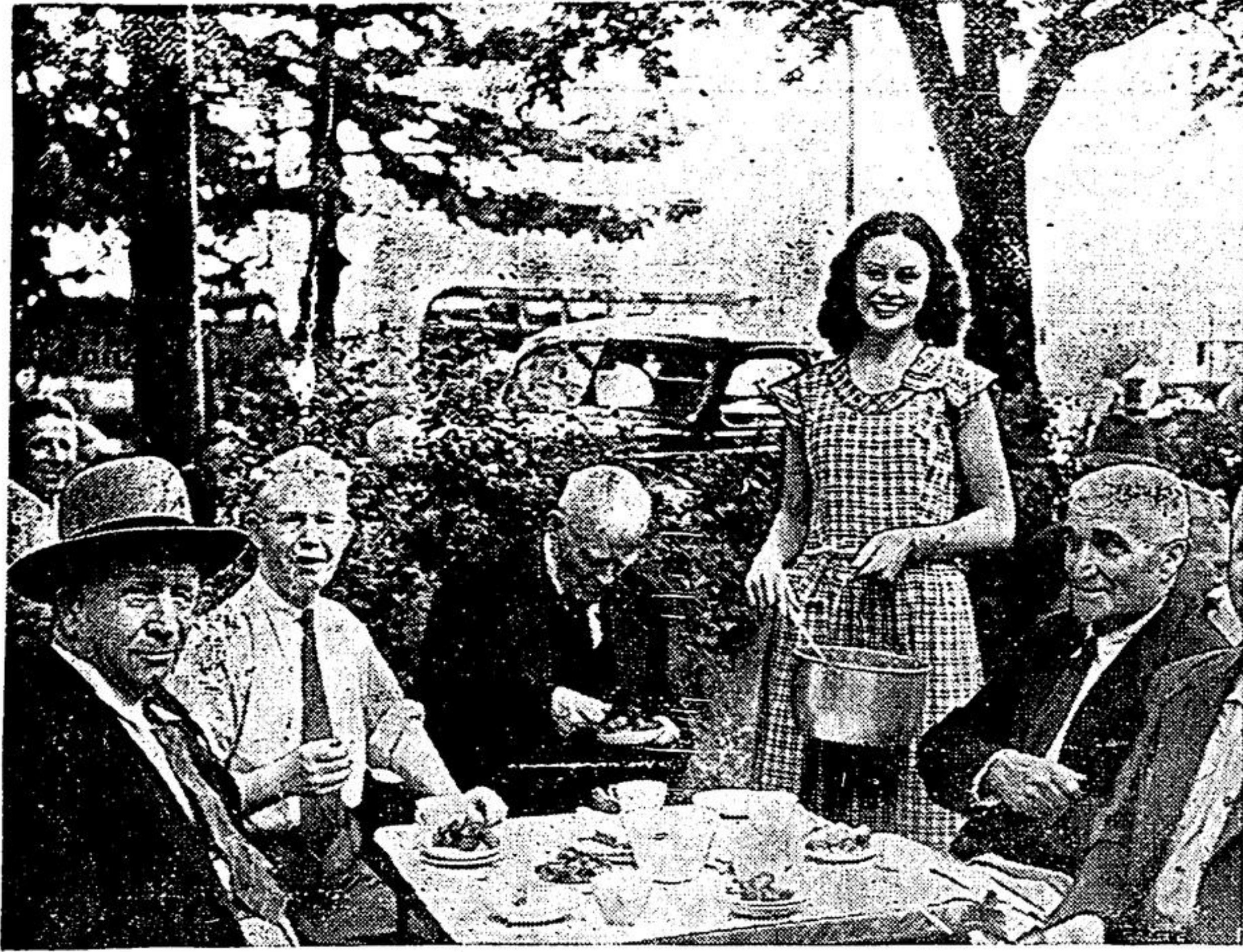


## Familiar Figure About Stouffville Enjoys Clarkson Picnic

### NEW SCARBORO STATION ENSURES HYDRO SERVICE

Flexibility of power distribution by the Ontario Hydro Power Commission will be increased by substantial hydro projects now being rushed to completion on the outskirts of Toronto.

Possibly this week the switch will be thrown to open the frequency changer and transformer station built at a cost of \$2,000,000 on a 45-acre site in Scarborough, East Toronto. This will connect the Niagara division with the Georgian Bay and Eastern Ontario divisions under a new system by which power from one area can easily be switched to another section where it is needed.

Another transformer station costing \$1,000,000 is under construction in Etobicoke Township, covering 100 acres, expected to be completed in the fall. This station will improve stability of power supply to Toronto by segregating the main lines.
