## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Lesson for August 3  
**Golden Text**—Train up a child in  
 the way he should go: and when he  
 is old, he will not depart from it.  
 —Prov. 22:6

**The Lesson as a Whole**  
 The Holy Scriptures have much  
 to say regarding the right relation-  
 ship of parents and children, and  
 the discipline of a godly home. Con-  
 cerning this there is a great deal of  
 laxity today, and conditions seem  
 to be growing worse instead of  
 better. It is incumbent upon all  
 who profess allegiance to the Lord  
 to heed the admonitions given in  
 this Book. There would not be so  
 many sad cases of child delinquency  
 if parents were more careful to  
 obey this instruction.

It is God who sets "the solitary  
 in families" (Psa. 68:6). With Him  
 the house hold is an entity and is  
 treated as such. (See Gen. 7:1; 18:19;  
 Exod. 12:4; Acts 11:14; 16:31.) He  
 holds parents responsible to order  
 their households aright and to  
 instruct them in the way of the  
 Lord. They are required to look  
 well to the behavior of their house-  
 holds (Prov. 31:27), and to bring  
 the children up "in the nurture and  
 admonition of the Lord" (Eph. 6:4).  
 This involves warning them against  
 evil habits and instructing them as  
 to the way of righteousness. Child-  
 ren thus warned and instructed are  
 far better prepared to go out into  
 the world, where they have to cope  
 with so many forms of sinful indul-  
 gence, than those left untaught and  
 allowed to drift along unwarned  
 into habits which, once entered  
 into, may exercise a control that  
 cannot be broken, save indeed by  
 the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

**Verse by Verse**  
 Prov. 1:8—"The instruction of thy  
 father...the law of thy mother." Wise  
 parents will not err by laxity and  
 indifference to the ways of  
 their children, on the one hand, nor  
 by undue severity on the other.  
 Parental rule should be for the good  
 of the family. Therefore, children  
 should be taught to recognize its  
 value and to yield obedience to it.

Chap. 6:21—"Bind them...upon  
 thine heart...lie them about thy  
 neck." Thus will the developing  
 life be enriched and beautified.  
 Nothing is more repulsive than a  
 wayward, undisciplined child, nor  
 more attractive than one who is  
 well-behaved and quietly subject to  
 parental authority.

Verse 22—"Where thou goest, it  
 shall lead thee when thou sleepest,  
 is shall keep thee; when thou  
 awakest, it shall talk with thee." The  
 verse pictures a life of obedi-  
 ence to parents, which saves from  
 wandering and preserves from  
 many a blunder, giving a sense of  
 satisfaction and peace of heart  
 under all circumstances.

Verse 23—"The reproofs of in-  
 struction are the way of life." The  
 young often resent correction and  
 reproof, but they who recognize the  
 fact that they are ever likely to err,  
 if they take their own way, will  
 regard parental guidance as a lamp  
 and a light to illumine the darkness  
 and direct them aright.

Chap. 17:6—"Children's children  
 are the crown of old men; and the  
 glory of children are their fathers." How  
 blessed a home is where the  
 grandparents can behold with de-  
 light the well-disciplined behavior  
 of their grandchildren and where  
 the children themselves look up to  
 and revere their parents!

Chap. 19:18—"Chasten thy son  
 while there is hope, and let not thy  
 soul spare for his crying." This runs  
 contrary to the foolish philosophy  
 of unhindered self-expression  
 taught by many today. The undi-  
 sciplined child is a nuisance in early

## Farmers Talk Strike Threat on Wheat Price

Ask 25c Bus. Increase — Alberta  
 Union Invades Manitoba for  
 Members

**WINNIPEG**—A growing measure  
 of criticism of the British wheat  
 contract was being heard among  
 western farmers this week. Indica-  
 tions of this were:

Threats of another non-delivery  
 strike (of grain only) this year for  
 an initial wheat price to the farm-  
 ers of \$1.60 a bushel (now \$1.35)  
 retroactive to last year's crop;

Invasion of Manitoba by the  
 Alberta Farmers' Union, which  
 organized last year's strike, seek-  
 ing membership at many points;

Circulation of a petition, said to  
 have been signed by several thou-  
 sands, demanding prices more in  
 line with U.S. prices; and

Organization of a farmers' pro-  
 tective association in Manitoba.

Other farmers, taking note of the  
 fact that negotiations will shortly  
 begin between Canada and Britain  
 over the contract price for 1948  
 wheat, are formulating demands  
 that the price, instead of being left  
 at a minimum of \$1.25 as presently  
 stipulated, should be increased to  
 at least \$1.75.

When the British wheat agree-  
 ment was announced a year ago,  
 with a price basis of \$1.55 a bushel  
 for 160 million bushels during the  
 first two years, it seemed to be  
 fairly generally acceptable.

That was because concurrently  
 farmers were given a guarantee of  
 a minimum price basis of \$1.35 per  
 bushel during a four-year period.  
 At that time opinion prevailed  
 that a recession might be in pros-  
 pect in wheat prices.

However, during the past year  
 western farmers have observed  
 that U.S. farmers have been getting  
 very much higher prices and, that  
 the Canadian Wheat Board has  
 selling wheat to other countries  
 than Great Britain at prices cor-  
 responding to American levels.

years and a disgrace to the family  
 as well as a menace to society in  
 later days. No maudlin sentiment-  
 ality should interfere with proper  
 parental chastening for willfulness  
 and disobedience.

Chap. 22:6—"Train up a child in  
 the way he should go; and when he  
 is old, he will not depart from it." The  
 parents' responsibility is to  
 start the child right. The word  
 rendered "train up" may also be  
 translated "dedicate." If we ded-  
 icate our children to God and seek  
 to guide them in the way of obedi-  
 ence, in their tender years, He will  
 watch over them and keep them in  
 the right way in later years.

Chap. 23:22—"Despise not thy  
 mother when she is old." Youth is  
 inclined to look with contempt  
 upon those whom they may con-  
 sider old-fashioned and out-of-date,  
 forgetting that wisdom often comes  
 as a result of years of experience.

Verse 23—"Buy the truth, and  
 sell it not." We should be eager to  
 know and follow that which is true  
 and right, and not barter away our  
 birthright for things that do not  
 profit.

Verse 24—"The father of the  
 righteous shall greatly rejoice." Par-  
 ents are made glad when their  
 children yield their hearts to God  
 and so walk in righteousness be-  
 fore Him. A wise son brings joy to  
 the heart of his father.

Verse 25—"She that bare thee  
 shall rejoice." The mother, too, is  
 cheered and made to give thanks  
 when her children walk in paths of  
 rectitude and filial obedience.

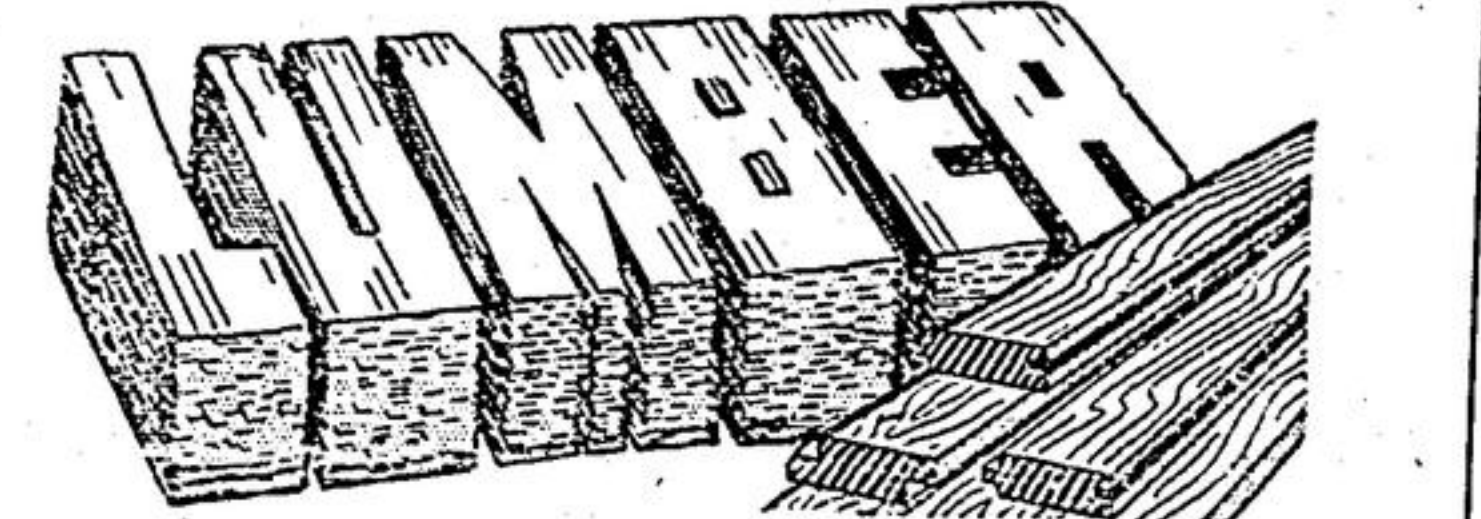
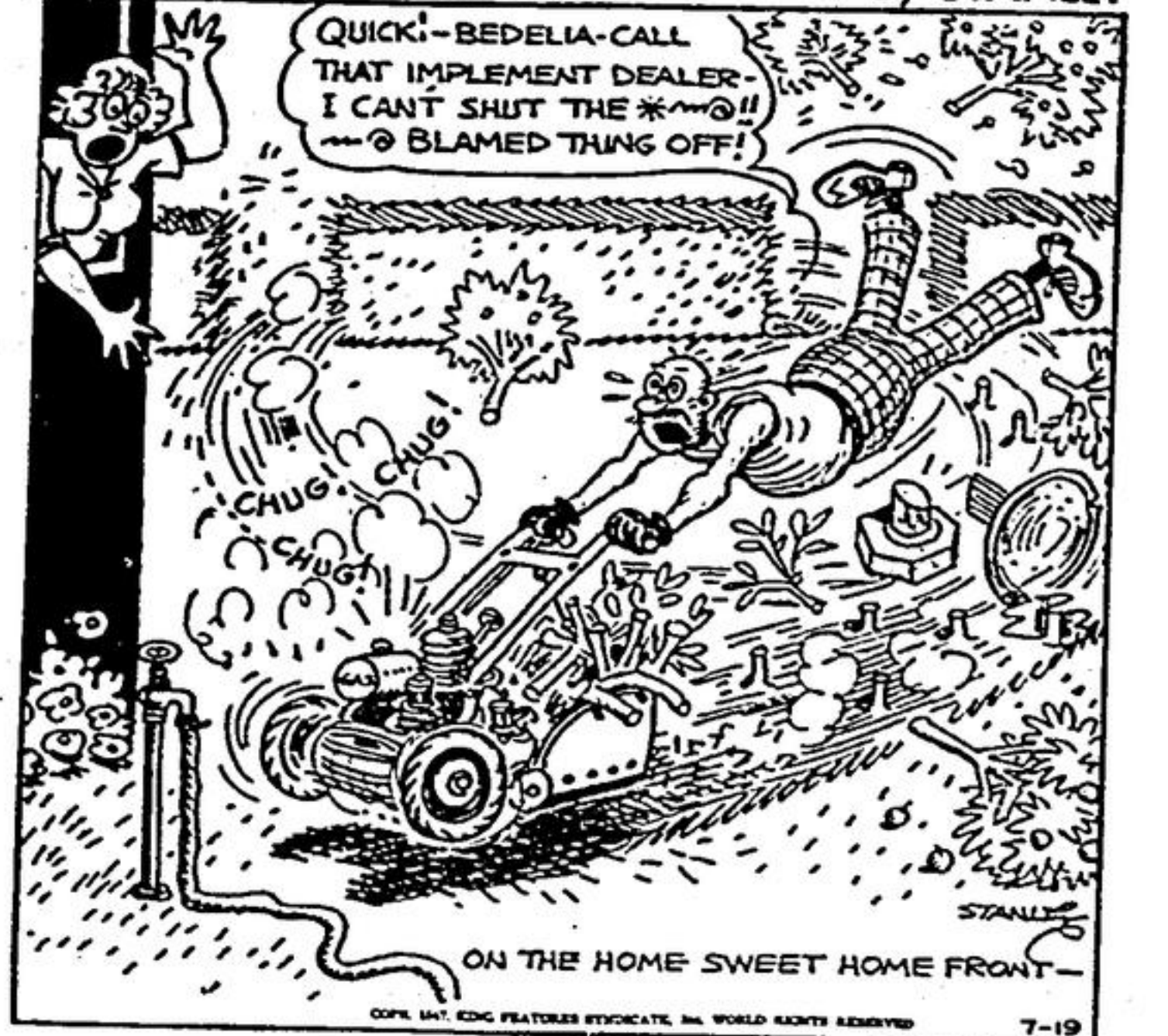
Verse 26—"My son, give me  
 thine heart." This is the call of God  
 to all who profess allegiance to His  
 Word. When the heart is wholly  
 His, the entire life will glorify Him.  
 "Let thine eyes observe my ways." A  
 subject walk is the outcome of a  
 yielded heart.

God holds parents responsible to  
 seek to guide their households  
 aright and to bring their children  
 up for Him. As they do this, He will  
 bless their efforts and work in the  
 hearts of the young; for while it is  
 very important to instill right  
 moral principles into the mind of a  
 child, it is ever necessary to stress,  
 above all else, the need of being in  
 a right relationship to God by the  
 new birth and obedience to His  
 Word, in order that one may  
 receive from Him the power,  
 through the indwelling Holy Spirit,  
 to overcome all sinful tendencies  
 and unclean habits. Children should  
 be admonished to avoid all evil  
 companionships and the indulgence  
 in anything that would have a ten-  
 dency to form such habits. But par-  
 ents should never overlook the fact  
 that morality and self-control, right  
 and precious as they are, do not  
 save.

There must be personal faith in  
 the Lord Jesus Christ in order to  
 become children of God.

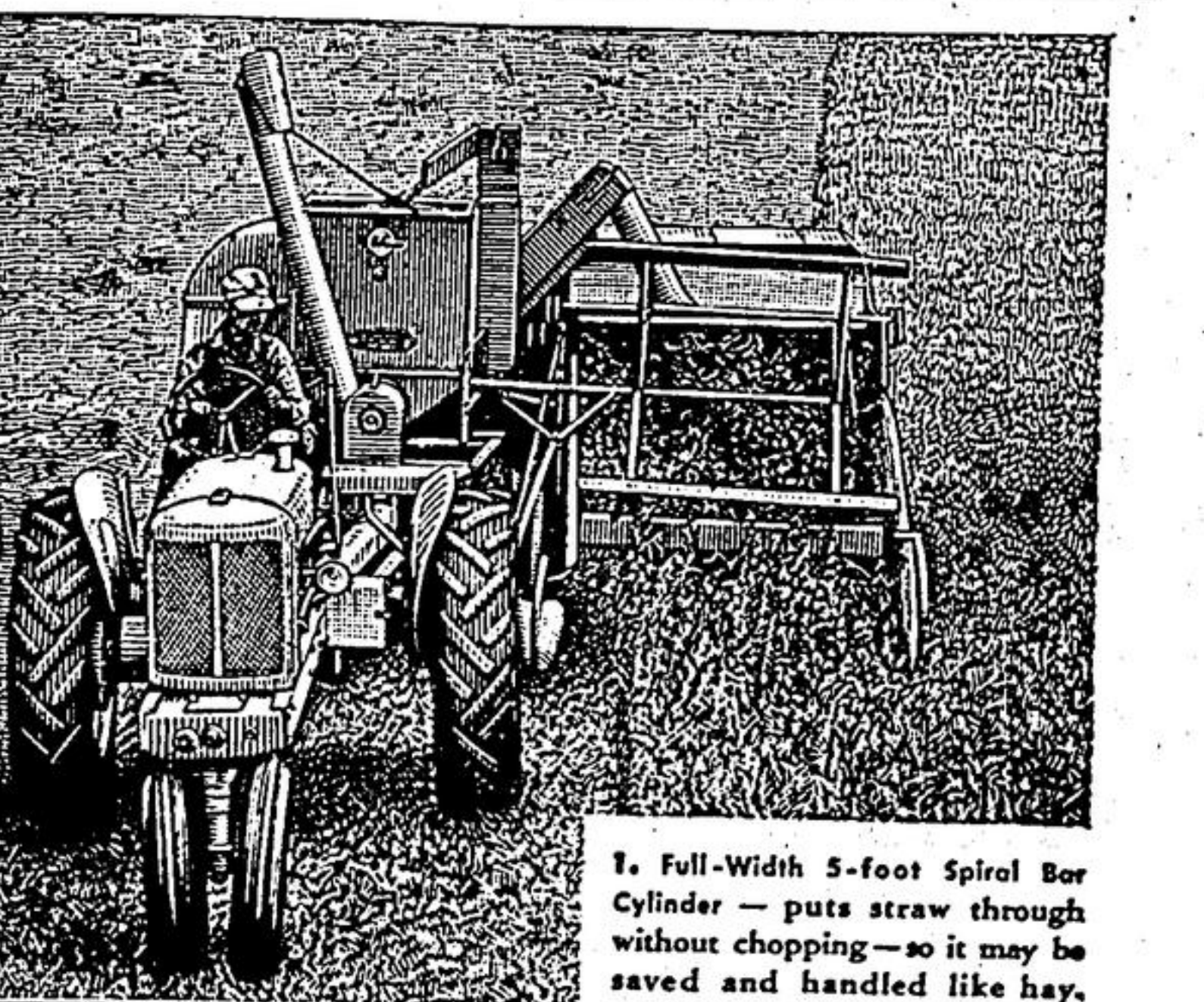
