Hello Homemakers! This column is devoted to your requested pickle recipes. You should have heard the folks rave about the aroma from our test batches of relishes. The listed recipes are those we have tested and are happy to have on file. Pickles provide zest to winter meals and those which can accompany many foods are most useful. We believe these are easy-to-make and score on colour, consistency and flavour.

**Spiced Gooseberries**  
2 1/2 qt. of berries, 1 cup of vinegar, 2 lbs. sugar, 1 tsp. cinnamon, 1/4 tsp. allspice, 1/2 tsp. cloves.  
Cut off the tails and stems of berries. Bring the vinegar and sugar to boiling point and add the spices, then add the gooseberries and simmer slowly for about 20 minutes. Bottle in small, air tight jars.

**Pear Chow Chow**  
8 pears, 3 onions, 3 sweet red peppers, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 cups vinegar, 1/2 cup water, 2 tps. salt, 2 tps. whole spice.  
Peel onions, remove seeds from peppers, put both through food chopper, using coarse knife. Peel and core pears. Cut in small cubes. Mix sugar, spices, salt and vinegar. Heat to boiling point. Add onions, peppers, pears and spices tied in a cheesecloth bag. Simmer 30 minutes on electric element turned low, stirring occasionally. Remove spices. Pour into hot sterilized jars. Seal. Yield: 4 pints.

**Hot Dog Relish**  
3 pounds (12 to 15) sweet red peppers, 3 pounds (12 to 15) green peppers, 3 pounds (12 to 15 medium) onions, 4 cups vinegar, 1 cup sugar, 1 tsp. mustard seed, 2 tps. dry mustard, 1 tsp. celery seed, 2 tps. salt.  
Peel onions, remove seeds from peppers, put both through food chopper, using coarse knife. Place in large preserving kettle, cover with boiling water and let stand 5 minutes. Drain thoroughly. Add vinegar, sugar, spices and salt; cook until vegetables are tender—about 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour into hot jars. Seal. Yield: 6 pints.

**Chutney Sauce**  
12 large, ripe tomatoes, 4 large onions, 1 green pepper, 1 sweet red pepper, 4 large apples, 1 cup chopped celery, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 cup vinegar, 2 tps. cinnamon, 1 tsp. cloves, 2 tps. salt, 1 tsp. pepper, 2 tps. mustard.

Blanch, peel and cut up tomatoes. Peel and chop onions, dice apples, peppers and celery. Combine all ingredients. Let come to a boil and then cook slowly until thick, taking care not to let it stick to the bottom of the pot and burn. Seal in sterilized jars.

**Tape a Tip**  
1. Powdered spices make a dark-colored chutney, whereas the whole spices leave a lighter relish. If you substitute whole spices for powdered mixtures use a little extra quantity.

2. Soaking cucumbers and onions in strong brine causes them to wrinkle.

3. Cider vinegar has a stronger aroma than the bleached vinegars, but may cause onions and celery to darken slightly.

4. Do not cook spicy sauces too long. Vinegar and spices help to retard chemical action.

**The Question Box**  
Mrs. C. B. asks: Recipe for Pickled Peaches.

**Answer:**  
**Pickled Peaches**  
8 lbs. ripe peaches, whole cloves, 1/2 cup water, 2 cups cider vinegar, 2 1/2 cups sugar, 3 tps. stick cinnamon, 1 tsp. root ginger, 2 tps. of mixed pickling spice, 1/2 lemon, thinly sliced.

Use large, firm peaches. Scald, skin and cut them in halves; stick two or three whole cloves in each half. Combine the vinegar, water, sugar, spices (tied in a cheesecloth bag) and the lemon slices; boil for

5 minutes. Simmer the peaches in the syrup, one layer at a time until tender; lift into sterile jars; fill to overflowing with the boiling syrup and seal at once. Yield: approximately 4 pints.

Miss M. T. asks: Recipe for Mint Pears.

**Answer:**  
**Mint Pears**  
Pare, core and put in slightly salted water, to prevent discoloration. Pack into prepared jars and fill with medium syrup to within 1 1/2 inches of top of jar. For each quart add 1/2 tsp. mint extract and enough pure green fruit coloring to give desired shade. Add flavoring and fruit coloring to syrup before filling jars. Partially seal and process in electric oven for 1 hour at 275 degrees F.

Mrs. J. G. asks: What has made my crabapple jelly very dark?

**Answer:** It is the result of too slow cooking.

Mrs. T. C. asks: Our currant jelly has sugar crystals in the bottom of jars. Should it be boiled again?

**Answer:** No, it will keep as it is. Crystals are caused either because sugar was not stirred until dissolved, or jelly was boiled too long.

## Says Mennonite Aid Helped Dutch In Dark Days

The house tops and streets were black with people—most of them weeping—and all gazing up into the sky waiting for the American and British bombers to open their doors. But it was not bombs this time. The starving Dutch in Amsterdam looked up with hysterical expectancy in a moment would come floating down.

Dr. T. O. Hylkema of Amsterdam was telling a capacity audience at First Mennonite Church in Kitchener of the emergency aid brought to Amsterdam and other cities when they were at the very point of starvation.

"It had been war, war and bombs for so long. Now came food—and a little bit of the love of Jesus Christ. It was overwhelming," he said in his rather hard-to-follow English.

## Expresses Thanks

Dr. Hylkema thanked the various Mennonite groups of Ontario for the aid they have given the Dutch through the Mennonite Central Relief Committee. At least 1,100,000 of Holland's 8,000,000 population have received food from the Mennonite committee. About 9,7000 have been given clothing.

This was the first time a Dutch Mennonite has addressed a Canadian church audience, according to the speaker.

He spoke of the trials and dangers still facing Dutch Mennonites who spent the war in German work camps and since then have been forced to Russia. The Germans took all Dutch Mennonites between ages of 16 and 60 to their work camps. A very large number have lost their lives.

Dr. Hylkema reported a revival of the old Mennonite principles in Holland and signs of it in other European countries. The success given by Mennonites in America has had something to do with the resurgence to the principles.

Meant Prison Term  
"Two years ago not one of our young people would join a non-resistant group, which meant danger of a three-year prison term," the speaker continued. "Today

there are 91 in Holland who have joined. The movement needs your support in Holland and in other countries where Mennonites are located."

He said it is hoped to build a Dutch peace seminary as a foundation for the non-resistance movement in Holland.

He believed continued revival of the original Mennonite principles in all countries would be a potent force for world peace.
