Verse 32 .- "I looked upon it, and received instructions." It is good indeed to ponder such conditions and to be humble enough to learn the lesson that they should teach us, namely, the importance of energetic labor while God gives health and strength for it.

Eccles. 5: 12.—"The sleep of a labouring man is sweet......but the abundance of the rich will not suffer him to sleep." The toiler, after a hard day's honest work, sleeps soundly and is refreshed thereby; while the rich idler, who feels no need to work either with his hands or his mind, tosses restlessly upon his bed, unable to sleep because of nervous anxiety concerning the safety of his wealth or because he has spent the hours of the day and evening in frivolous pursuit, if not in positive dissipation.


The Heart of the Lesson The Word of God insists on the

dignity and value to mankind of daily work. In lands where the Bible is unknown, manual labor is considered beyond the dignity of many and is left to menials and often to the women of the household, while the men live in idleness and sensual pleasures. But both in the Hebrew Scriptures of the Old Testament and the later revelation given in the New Testament the worker is praised and the sluggard condemned. Slothfulness does not make for lasting happiness, such as is found in a sense of worth-while accomplishment. The Christian workman is to glorify God in his daily tasks for he serves the Master, whose handiwork is manifested in all creation.


