Alvin, Taborn, 23, remanded in custody for judgment following his trial on charge of receiving cash, postal notes, postage stamps, unemployment insurance stamps, money order blanks, registered two date stamps and the register mail receipt book, which were stolen from the Sutton post office on August 16, was convicted and sentenced to four years' imprisonment by Magistrate O. Alternative charges that the pair broke into the post office and stole the goods were withdrawn at the request of the crown. Arthur Maloney represented the two accused prior to judgment. They were unrepresented at their trial last week.

MEDICAL PLAN COVERS ONLY DOCTOR BILLS

TORONTO, Sept. 15—The province-wide medical care plan, announced Wednesday and sponsored by the Ontario Medical Association, is being organized to pay physicians' and surgeons' bills and will not cover costs of medical equipment, drugs and medicines, Dr. Melville C. Watson, chairman of the new organization, said yesterday.

Head offices of the group, to be known as Physicians' Services, Inc., will be in Toronto.

Contributory fees will be decided in a month and the plan is expected to be in operation around Nov. 1, Dr. Watson said. It is expected 2,000,000 persons will be enrolled by that time.

"There remains a great deal of fine legal work to be done regarding agreements for subscribers."

The first agreements are likely to be for obstetrical and surgical pre-paid medical care with agreements for complete medical and surgical coverage following soon after. No hospitalization is included.

Dr. Watson pointed out that the new scheme has no relation to the Associated Medical Services which has been in operation for ten years and has 42,000 individual subscribers, nor to the Ontario Hospital Association Blue Cross Plan for hospital users, which has operated for six years with 800,000 subscribers enrolled on a group basis.

DEALS DEATH BLOW TO FAMILY OF SKUNKS
