

THIS KNOWLEDGE

Q.—How can I remove rust from nickelplate?
 A.—By covering with oil of grease, or mutton tallow. Allow it to remain for two or three days, then rub thoroughly with rottenstone, wash with ammonia, polish with whiting. Kerosene applied frequently will prevent nickel from rusting.
 Q.—How can I restore thin silk?
 A.—Dip it into a weak solution of gum arabic, two level teaspoons dissolved in a quart of water, and then strain through cheesecloth.
 Q.—How can I get rid of fleas?
 A.—These pests can often be exterminated by spraying the place which is infested with them with oil of pennyroyal.
 Q.—How can I clean a porcelain bathtub, or any enameled surface?
 A.—By rubbing with a woolen woolen cloth dampened in gasoline. To remove discolorations, dissolve one teaspoon of chloride of lime, put into a vessel of cold water and boil for an hour. Rub the spots with this solution.
 Q.—How can I remedy a too

salty taste in food?
 A.—When soup, gravy, or vegetables are too salty, stir a little coarse brown sugar into it, and the salty taste will disappear. Or, add one tablespoon of sugar and one of vinegar.
 Q.—How can I keep the powder puff fluffy?
 A.—The puff will remain soft and fluffy if washed in warm, soapy water, and then rinsed in soapy water.
 Q.—How can I remove paint from window glass?
 A.—Rub with hot, strong vinegar. Repeat if necessary.
 Q.—How can I keep the leather in shoes soft after it has become wet?
 A.—When the toes of shoes are wet, stuff them with tissue paper, and they will keep their shape. They should not be dried too quickly, because it will make the leather stiff and weak.
 Q.—How can I make a paste?
 A.—Take one-half cupful of lump starch and mix thoroughly into one quart of water, and boil slowly for a few minutes.

Q.—How can I remove a scorched taste in food?
 A.—When fruit or food has become scorched or burned, drop a small piece of charcoal into the vessel immediately and the scorched taste will disappear.
 C.—How can I relieve the pain of a sore corn?
 A.—Touching it with a little oil of peppermint often gives relief.
