## HYDRO ORDERS ANOTHER NEAR "BLACK-OUT" FOR MERCHANTS

A modified form of power rationing is now in effect throughout Ontario, and of course, effects the people of Stouffville and district. Electricity for signs, show windows and ornamental lighting is prohibited. Merchants in Stouffville may have sufficient light at the front of their stores however, to make walking safe, and if they feel their situation needs clarification, the reeve or the hydro committee should be appealed to. Some merchants may seize this opportunity to make their place too dark, in the hope of saving a few cents, which they would lose in other ways, if the black-out is carried too far. Make sure there is enough light to make entry to your store safe and easy at all times.

Penalties range up to \$100 a day for failure to obey the ration ordinance.

Saving of 100,000 kilowatts, equivalent to 140,000 horsepower, is expected, according to Mr. Strike.

Hope to Save Five Per Cent.  
 Domestic users are not directly affected, but it is "hoped" they will save another 50,000 kilowatts roughly five per cent. of consumption.

The regulations, Mr. Strike stated do not go as far as wartime restrictions.

Prohibited are air heaters, electric grates or electric boilers used for heating stores or offices, and lighting of interiors of business premises after business hours, unless work is being done. Exception will be made for banks and other firms requiring light for protection.

Restrictions are imposed on electricity for floodlighting of parking lots, used-car lots, service stations, outdoor industrial premises and lighting of theatre marquees, entrances and exits.

Domestic users are affected by regulations of lighting exits or entrances where the maximum power allowed is five watts per foot of width. Lighting of outdoor Christmas trees is banned.

Use of electricity for interior domestic purposes and in hospitals is not prohibited, nor is floodlighting of airports, lighting for police and fire services and protection, lighting required by law and lighting for direction signs and signs designating the offices of medical practitioners.

Mr. Strike said flood-lit games such as football or baseball would not be affected by the order.

**Cut Street Lighting**  
 Exemptions may be granted by the commission, but Mr. Strike said they will be extended only where public health and safety are endangered.

Street lighting is forbidden between sunrise and sunset, but Mr. Strike said the commission expected to get a large voluntary saving from municipalities who have increased street lighting since the war.

"We made a sincere attempt to put the voluntary scheme in effect," explained Strike. "We feel these regulations are necessary to get the full benefit of the voluntary campaign. These rules will provide only a part of the savings necessary to maintain full employment. It is, therefore, vital that consumers, workers, farmers, storekeepers and businessmen do their part."

"We have had good voluntary co-operation, particularly from larger theatres, but even those people who did co-operate will agree to get uniformity we need some restrictions. There are many people with signs and to get everyone to co-operate voluntarily is practically impossible," he continued.

Amount of U.S. funds Canadian banks may issue to Canadians without filing out a special form has been cut from \$100 to \$25, though no change of policy has been made.

## Pleads Guilty On Fraud Charges

Kenneth Brillinger, Lake Wilcox, pleaded guilty to all but one of five charges of fraud in magistrate's court at Newmarket. Magistrate Hollinrake reserved sentence for one week, and the one charge to which the accused pleaded not guilty was also held over. The offences were all dated around August, 1947.

C. C. Mabley, Richmond Hill, testified that he had bought a truck from Brillinger and later found that the accused had not paid for the truck. Mabley operates a service station in Richmond Hill. He said he was defrauded \$160.

Robert Brown, who operates a service station and general store, testified that the accused had ordered two tires and tubes from him. Brillinger did not call for the tires for some time but finally came and gave Brown a cheque for \$93. The tires cost \$31.75 and Brown gave him back \$38 in cash. The accused told Brown he would pay the balance when he was paid for a job he was doing in Toronto and that was why he wanted the cash and credit. Later, the bank returned the cheque to Brown marked "no account." The cheque that the accused had endorsed was made payable to K. Brillinger and signed W. C. Smith and was a Toronto branch cheque.

Brillinger was also charged with cashing a bad cheque in a Newmarket bank. Chief Constable Ronald Watt said that he arrested the accused in Newmarket. Chief Watt said that the accused told him that he had made out the cheque and signed it W. C. Smith. "Apparently a fictitious name," said Crown Attorney Arleigh Armstrong. Chief Watt said that the accused was very co-operative in giving the evidence.

On the fourth charge Det. George Wilson said the North End Tire and Battery, Toronto had taken a cheque from Brillinger for \$74.80 for tires that cost \$33.28. They paid Brillinger the balance of the cheque value.

Magistrate Hollinrake said he would postpone sentence, which would be imprisonment, for one week. He told Brillinger to communicate with anyone who might speak on his behalf before next

Friday.  
 Brillinger had been living in Newmarket during the summer and said that he, his wife and two children have been living at Wilcox Lake recently. He asked for the opportunity of making reparations to the complainants. He said that he had had some hospital bills to pay for his wife and one of his children, and was having financial difficulties.

## New Marketing Methods March Along

Potatoes from the Goodwood growers are going into the city market now put up in ten pound paper sacks, ready to go on the sales in the big stores without rehandling. Thus the marketing methods of the farmer ever marches ahead. This is one of the answers to the influx every fall of P.E.I. and New Brunswick stock.

Todd's at Goodwood are putting up the tubers in the small paper sacks and find it a great deal more work, but the market demands the improvement and they're going to do it. It takes a man full time weighing up the stock as others make ready the potatoes for bagging. A fifteen pound sack has been used, but the tens are more in demand—something the housewife can readily pick up from the store and carry home. The potatoes are run into funnel-shaped containers calculated to hold ten pounds and are weighed, then bagged, placed on the truck and away to the city in short order. No dirt or under-sized potatoes can possibly get into the bags with the modern machinery used in sorting and bagging.

Farmers are getting \$1.50 per 75 pound bag at the farm, we understand, which is considered a fair price, yet not too high by any means in relation to everything the farmer has to buy to grow a crop of potatoes.

While the rising cost-of-living in Canada is causing much concern, it may be interesting to report that officials here point out that it is still lower than in the United States or Britain, if that is any comfort.

Rental control over dwellings is not expected to be lifted as soon as some people would seem to believe, it is learned in the capital.

"The Canadian people cannot be told that the United States is not vitally interested in Canada, it major world customer," commented Hon. John Bracken.

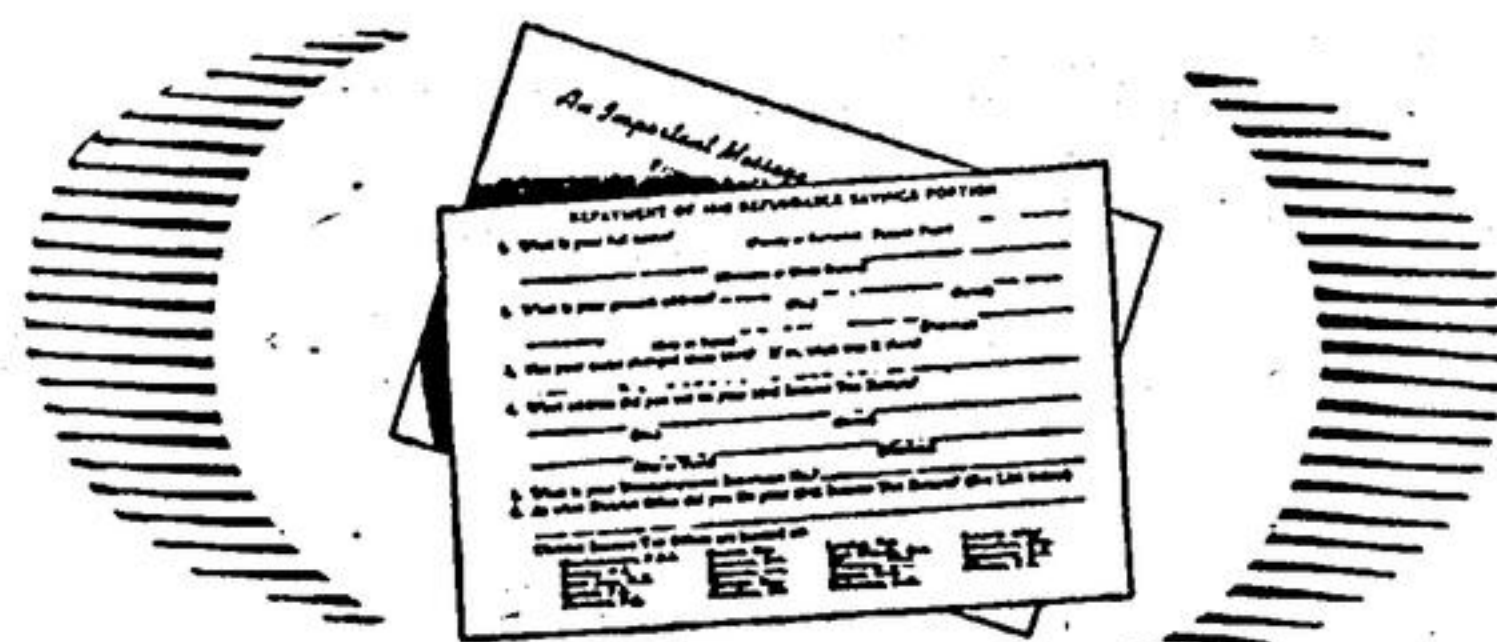
