



## TIME TAKES A TUMBLE



CANADA'S FASTEST PLANE -One hour and 48 minutes flying time was slashed from the transcontinental flight record recently when a new pressurized North Star Skyliner of Trans-Canada Air Lines flashed across the 2,345 miles from Vancouver to Montreal in just six hours and 52 minutes to set a new mark. The new North Star, shown in upper photo, spanned the distance at an average altitude of 20,000 feet and speed of 342 milesper-hour with no discomfort to the 20 passengers and crew of six. 1/2 cup rice, pearl barley or noodles and 1 cup tomatoes.

Wipe the meat, cut the lean part into cubes. Cover with cold water, heat slowly to the simmering point. Remove the scum as it forms. After simmering for 2 hours, add the vegetables and seasonings. Simmer for at least 1 hour longer. We like our fair share of meat and vegetables. You may prefer to strain them out for a clear, sparkling bouillon.

TAKE A TIP

Vegetable water poured down the sink means food value wasted. Canned soups take on new zest with the addition of vegetable water, but remember to go easy on the salt if the vegetables have been salted.

If you have oversalted the soup, there is something you can do about it. Slice a raw potato and add it to the soup. Remove potato before serving.

The nutritive value of the outside leaves of cabbage is good even though they are not attractive. Wash thoroughly and add to soup stock for flavour. Remove before serving.

A dash of chili sauce and a bouil-

lon cube added to blended soups on dehydrated noodle soups, makes æ richer food. Simmer soup. Do not boil.
