HUNT 400,000 CANADIANS FOR REFUND ON INCOME TAX
Ottawa, Dec. 18—Officials of the income tax division of the Revenue Department are scouring Canada for a "lost legion" of approximately

400,000 taxpayers to whom refunds are due on the refundable portion of their income tax payments for 1942, a department official said yesterday.

By advertising campaigns in newspapers, mailing out cards, the department has succeeded in locating a considerable proportion of its tax creditors, but there are still thousands yet to be found.

One-third of the 1,200,000 men and women the department must reimburse before March 31, 1948, have moved from their 1942 place

of residence, married, changed their names, or died, said the officials.

And it's up to income tax officials to hunt the lost ones down and pay them back the money due. On personal income tax the total is more than \$80,000,000.

Payoff of the refundable portion now is being made in the case of two classes of taxpayers. First is to those over 66 years of age, whose income in the last year did not exceed \$5,000. The second is to the estates of deceased taxpayers.

In Heb. 11: 13, 39, 40 he is numbered with other worthies to be resurrected who "died in faith not having received the promise." See also Acts 7:5. Paul tells us of the gospel preached before unto Abraham saying, In thee shall all nations be blessed," Gal. 3:8. V16 says "Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made.....thy seed, which is Christ"; V28, 29, "there is neither Jew nor Greek..... bond nor free.....ye are all me in Christ Jesus. And if ye be Christ's then ye are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise." When God fulfils his covenant then the Song of the Redeemed will be sung, Rev. 5: 9, 10, also fulfilling the angelic prophecy at the birth of Christ.
