Medical history was made in Toronto this month when the "doctor insurance" plan of the Ontario Medical association went into operation. To celebrate the event, Marie Calow, a secretary, was given a year's free subscription as the first' person enrolled.

The presentation was made at the York club by Hon. Russell Kelley, Ontario minister of health. This signalled the birth of a non-profit prepaid service which for many years was only an idea on paper. The plan is called Physicians' Ser-

vices Incorporated.
A total of 500 have been enrolled in Toronto thus far, Stewart Major, enroll include an insurance company office, a small manufacturing concern, the executive workers in a metal products company, and a car-Wheelbarrow of the staff enrolled. There is a man in Canada who has the blood of seven total strangers in his veins. Maybe you wince at that idea. He doesn't. Without it, he would be dead.

Two years ago he was seriously injured in a crash. He received desperate head injuries, and a delicate operation was imperative. But shock and loss of blood had so weakened him that he couldn't have survived one. If . . . seven strangers had not stepped in.


