## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Lesson for March 28  
Golden Text.—And this is life  
eternal, that they might know thee  
the only true God, and Jesus Christ,  
whom thou hast sent.—John 17:3

The Lesson as a Whole  
As we come once more to the  
Easter season, we are to think not  
only of our blessed Lord's glorious  
triumph over death, but also of  
that new life which He imparts to  
all who put their trust in Him. He  
has said, "Because I live, ye shall  
live also" (John 14:19). As the  
risen one He has become the head  
of the new creation, to which all  
belong who have been saved by  
His grace (2 Cor. 5:17, where "new  
creature" might better be rendered  
"new creation"). The creation  
stands in Christ (1 Cor. 15:22).  
Eternal life is not merely prolonged  
existence. It is not a synonym for  
immortality. Rather it is a new  
and divin<sup>e</sup> life, which was mani-  
fested in all its fullness in Jesus  
when here upon earth and as now  
exalted to God's right hand in  
Heaven (1 John 5:20). No man  
possesses this life as a result of  
natural birth. It is received when  
one is born again by the Word and  
Spirit of God. He who possesses it  
has capacity for fellowship with the  
Father and the Son (John 17:3).  
He who does not yet know Christ  
is bereft of this life (1 John 5:12)  
and is regarded by God as dead in  
trespasses and sins (Eph. 2:1).  
Until born from above, and thus  
quickened together with Christ, all  
men are alienated from God and  
can do nothing to merit His favor.  
That we might have this eternal  
life our Lord became man, died for  
our sins on the cross, and rose  
triumphantly from the dead. Now  
He gives life to all who come to  
Him in faith. He has declared, "I  
am the resurrection, and the life: he  
that believeth in me, though he  
were dead, yet shall he live: and  
whosoever liveth and believeth in  
me shall never die" (John 11:25,  
26). Apart from His resurrection,  
men would have to die in hopeless  
despair, but He has, by going into  
death and coming up again, abolish-  
ed, or annulled, him that had the  
power of death, that is, the Devil,  
that He might deliver from the  
fear of death all who believe in  
Him. (Heb. 2:14, 15).

Verse by Verse  
Col. 3:1.—"Risen with Christ."  
This is true of all Christians. We  
died with Christ in His death. We  
have now been raised with Him and  
so no longer belong to the world  
that crucified Him. Our interests  
now are connected with the place  
to which He has gone. It should be  
our joy to be occupied with that

heavenly scene of which He is the  
centre and to which we belong as  
partakers of His risen life. Occupa-  
tion with Christ is the antidote for  
sin in every form.  
Verse 2.—"Set your affection on  
things above." For "affection" the  
Revised Version has "mind," and  
this is the better translation. We  
are called to be heavenly-minded.  
As our thoughts are engaged with  
things above we will be freed from  
the drag of earthly interests. Some  
object to the Christian being char-  
acterized by other-worldliness, but  
this is the only way to be delivered  
from the power of this present evil  
age.

Verse 3.—"Ye are dead," or, more  
literally, "ye have died;" that is,  
the former manner of life has  
ended in the cross, as we recognize  
the truth that—Christ's death is our  
death, even as His life is our life,  
a life hid with Christ in God. The  
realization of this will lift us far  
above the groveling things of earth.  
Verse 4.—"When Christ..... shall  
appear, then shall ye also appear  
with him in glory." Christ, our life,  
is now hidden from the eyes of  
men. At His second advent He will  
again appear in visible human form,  
and all who have received life from  
Him will then be openly manifested  
with Him in the splendor of His  
glory.

Verse 12.—"Put on therefore." As  
new creatures in Christ, we are to  
do the garments of holiness. We  
are called to put on those charac-  
teristics which belong to the new  
creation.  
Verse 13.—"Forbearing..... and  
forgiving." It is most inconsistent  
for those who are themselves the  
objects of God's matchless grace to  
hold grudges or manifest an unfor-  
giving spirit toward others. We  
are called to forgive "even as  
Christ forgave" us.

Verse 14.—"Above all these  
things put on charity," or love,  
"which is the bond," or girdle, "of  
perfection." As the Oriental binds  
his flowing robes about him with  
his girdle, so we are to hold all the  
virtues mentioned above in their  
proper place with the girdle of  
perfection, which is the divine love  
shed abroad in our hearts by the  
Holy Spirit.

Verse 15.—"Let the peace of God  
rule in your hearts." Peace, with  
God is the portion of every believer  
(Rom. 5:1). The peace of God is  
ours as we learn to commit every-  
thing to God in prayer (Phil. 4:6,  
7). The word rendered "rule" really  
suggests an umpire—one who sees  
that all goes according to the  
proper order.  
Verse 16.—"Let the word of Christ  
dwell in you richly." The "word"  
is that precious truth which God  
has revealed to us and which is  
embodied in our Bible. We are to  
revel in this; to read and meditate  
upon it, in order that it may have  
its cleansing influence upon our  
souls and its sanctifying power in  
our lives. Then those lives will be  
lyrical, and we shall have a song  
of praise constantly welling up in  
our hearts.  
Verse 17.—" whatsoever ye do.....

The Heart of the Lesson  
That all men are without divine  
or eternal life in their natural state  
is the clear teaching of Holy  
Scripture. When Christ is received  
He gives life eternal, and this life  
is manifested by new desires and  
by detestation of the sins that once  
held the soul in bondage. As we  
are occupied with the risen Christ  
at God's right hand, we are deliver-  
ed from the power of the world; and  
enabled to triumph over all that  
would mar our fellowship with the  
Father and the Son. When our Lord  
returns we shall be fully conform-  
ed to Him—for we will be trans-  
formed into His glorious image the  
moment we behold His face.
