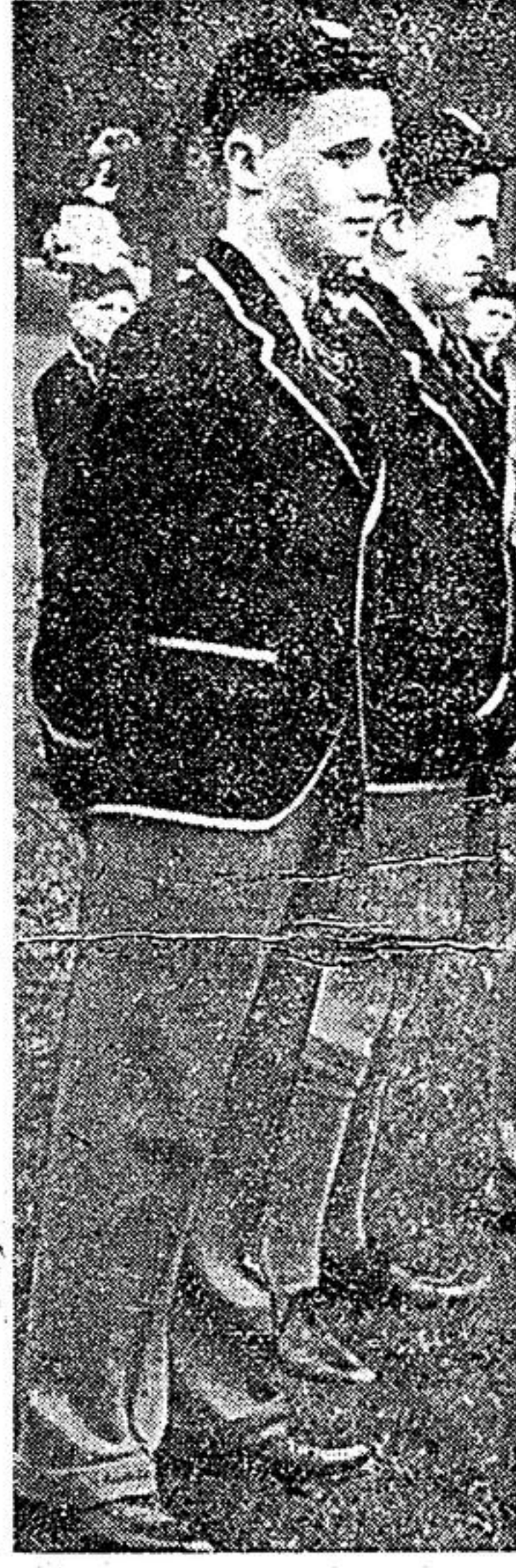

- To the Township of Whitby \$29,329 or 15.9 mills off the Tax Rate
- To the Township of Reach \$29,302 or 14.4 mills off the Tax Rate
- To the Township of Scugog \$7,300 or 18.2 mills off the Tax Rate
- To the village of Port Perry \$26,955 or 40.6 mills off the Tax Rate
