**UXBRIDGE IS SURE AUTO TROUBLE STILL NEEDS LAW**  
Uxbridge, May 23—The automobile, Uxbridge town fathers are quite sure, is with us to stay. But there are still quite a few horses on the town's streets. In order to keep its traffic situation as tidy as possible, the town is issuing a six-page pamphlet containing the by-law governing operation of vehicles and horses. The by-law has one or two clauses not likely to be found in the traffic regulations of most urban municipalities.  
For instance, the by-law stipulates: "That no person shall break in or train any horse, mare or gelding, in any street or public place." There is also some restraint placed on the town's firefighters. A clause referring to them says: "That the driver of any fire apparatus, when returning from a fire or any alarm of fire, shall not travel at an excessive speed and must use the same care and diligence as other traffic." The by-law doesn't mention what the driver is supposed to do going to a fire.  
Next week these booklets are to be distributed to motorists using the town's thoroughfares, as hints not to double-park or otherwise impede the free movement of traffic. A market centre for the surrounding farm districts, Uxbridge sometimes gets a bit congested. Just the same, it is evident the town lawmakers welcome their cus-
