CLAIMS TAXES EXCEED NEED OF DOMINION

Brougham, May 26—The charge that the King Government is collecting \$55 more per capita in taxes than is needed for expenditures, was made here tonight by John G. Diefenbaker, M.P. for Lake Centre at a meeting supporting Frank McCallum, Progressive Conservative candidate in Ontario riding in the federal by-election. This \$55 is what the announced federal surplus represents, he said.

Mr. Diefenbaker attacked the Abbott budget as a "terrible disappointment to the people of Canada" and claimed that "the small reductions made the other day on sales tax will have practically no effect on living costs."

"It will amount to a saving of only \$22,000,000 out of the \$325,000,000 the government extracted last year," he said. "This year the government will take \$26.25 in sales taxes for every man, woman and child compared to the \$28 they took last year."

On the other hand the government had done nothing to reduce prices. The longer the prices committee sits, the higher prices rise, he claimed.

Mr. Diefenbaker said the Progressive Conservative party is pledged to remove sales taxes and raise the tax exemptions on lower income taxes. His party's solution to the problem of rising prices is in expanding production which at present is being held down by excessive taxation. He claimed the King Government has made no serious effort to put into effect a comprehensive program of development designed to expand primary or secondary industries. Only sixty cents of every \$100 is being spent in the development of Canada's natural resources.

He said his party plans to institute a National Development Council to develop our natural resources and keep young Canadians from leaving the Dominion. He charged that 32,000 had left Canada last year because they could not find proper opportunities here and of these 2,900 were university-trained technical experts. This drain on Canada must be stopped, he declared.

Markham Twp. Reeve Urges Investigation Of County Police

York County Council last week quashed a demand by three members for a thorough investigation into the police department, and Chief of Police George Stuart was reinstated. He had been suspended following an accident in Toronto. He was cleared of charges of careless driving by the courts.

Chief Stuart was allowed a three months leave of absence by council when it was reported that the findings at the court case indicated he had suffered a slight stroke. This leave was allowed to enable him to recover his health sufficiently to carry on the job.

Maintaining the police department did not have the confidence of the people, Reeve L. J. Cockburn, of Georgina, declared. "There are many of the opinion that is not right in the top bracket of the force."

"Top to Bottom" Reeve W. Griffin, of Markham, urged that a special private committee be appointed to undertake a complete investigation. He felt this should cover all members "from top to bottom."

"Something seems to be glossed over, and it looks strange," Reeve O. E. Crookford, of Scarborough, said referring to the case in which the chief of police was implicated.

Swansea representative, Reeve W. E. Brandon, declared there seems to be little reason for both

a police commission and a committee to govern the force, and added there is no liaison between the two.

"If the man is so disabled, why is it that we did not hear of it before the accident?" Reeve Griffin questioned. "If this is true, he evidently is not in the physical condition to carry on his duties on the force."

An overall increase of pay amounting to \$150 annually for the police, and urged by the committee, was turned down. The committee pointed out that no raise was given in 1947 or this year, and that the salaries of suburban and city police had increased considerably in that time.

Salaries Set
Police salaries were budgeted at \$33,510 for 1948.
Deputy Reeve C. O. Moffat questioned how a police force is to

be encouraged to carry on its work in the best possible manner without being paid in accordance to its duties." The recommendation was lost when only seven voted in favor of the boost.

During Chief Stuart's leave of absence, Detective W. E. Martin-dale will continue as acting Chief Constable.

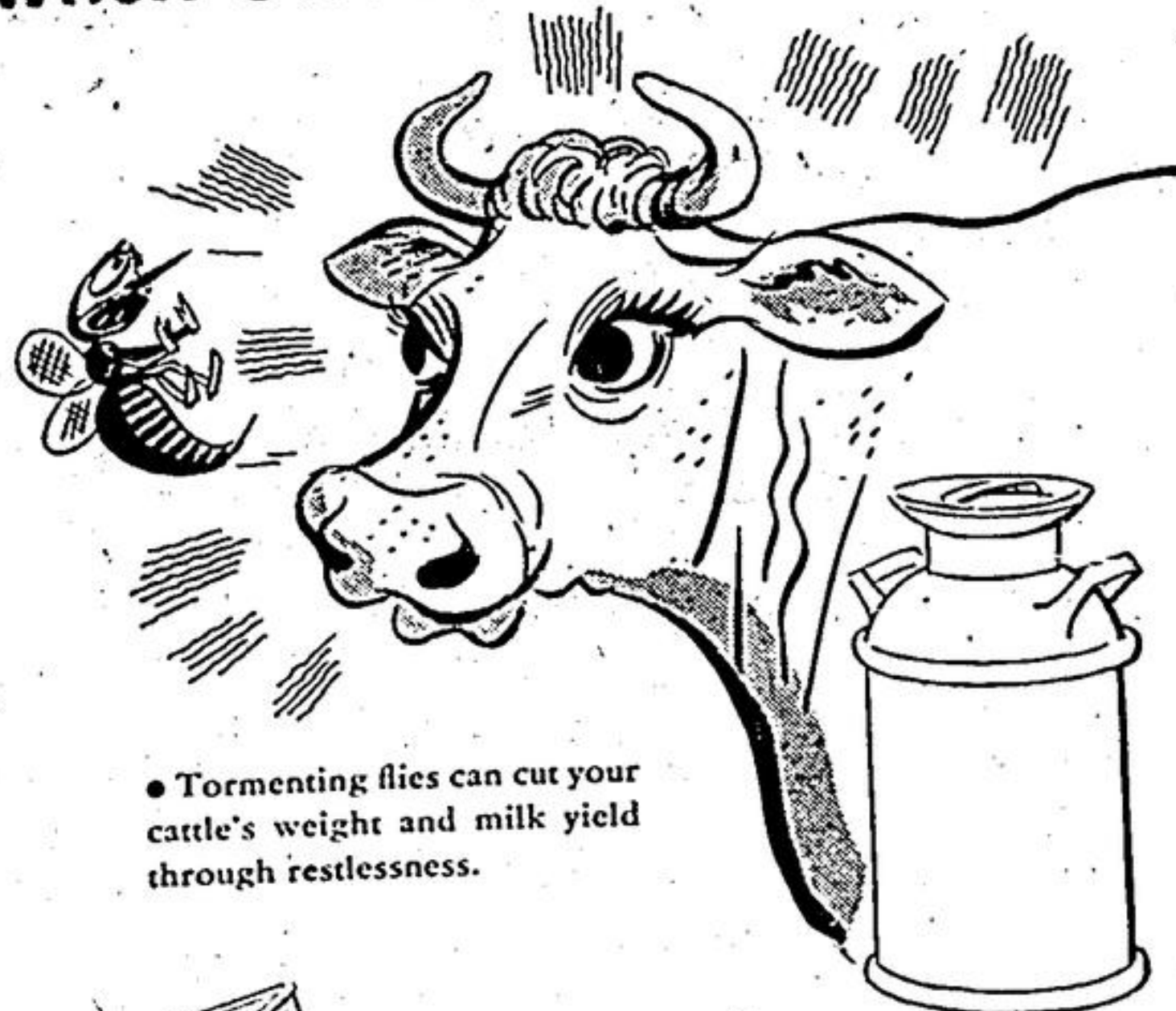

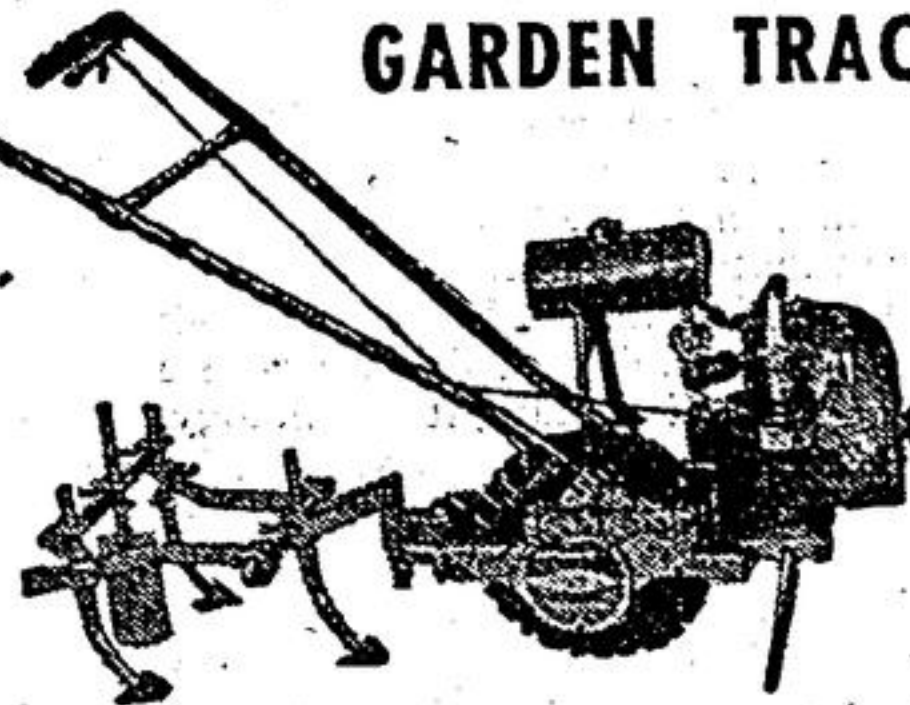
