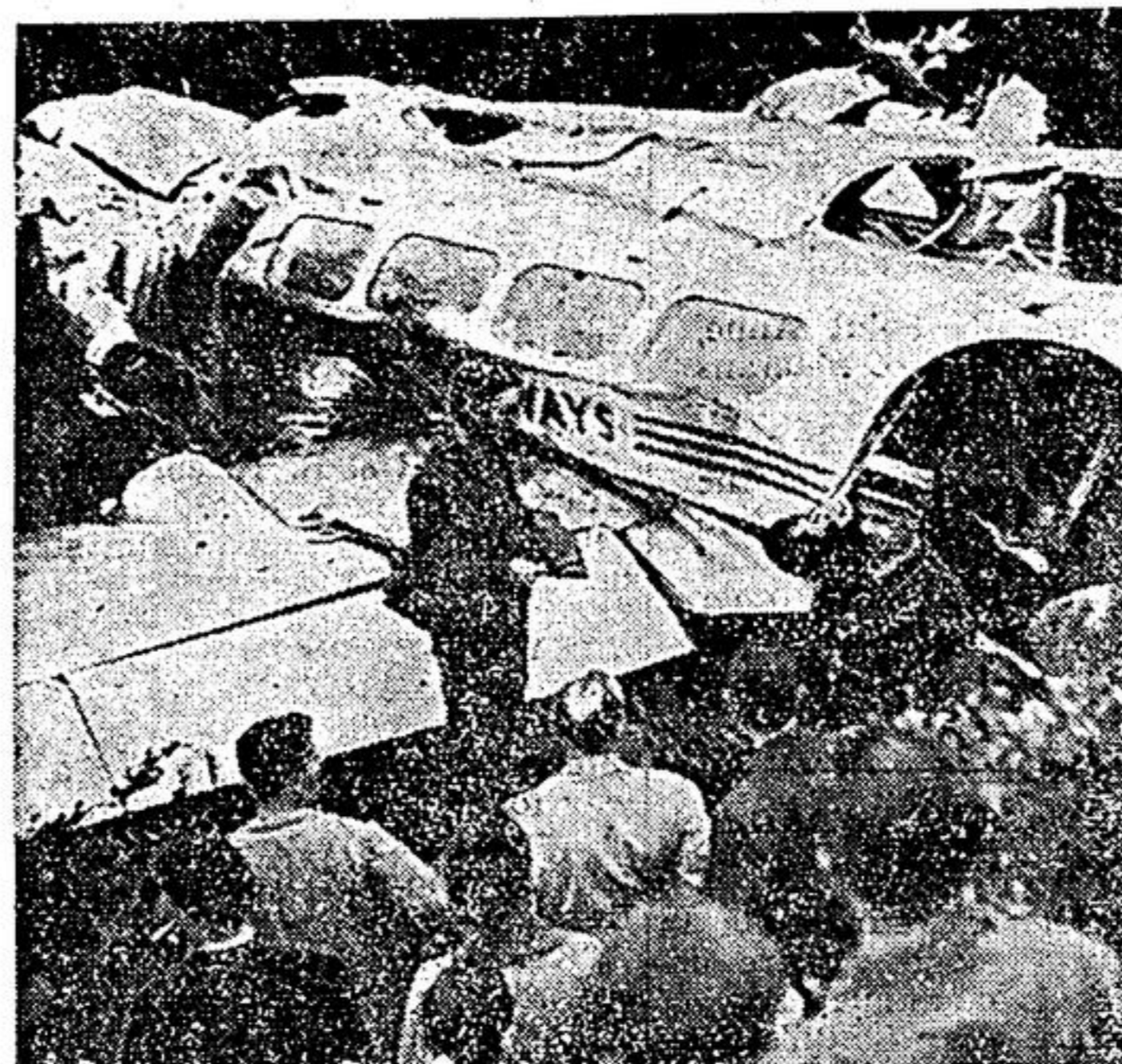

Polk was missing for a week before his body was found, hands and feet bound with twine. He had been shot through the head. The Greek government is making an intensive investigation.

Here is the wreckage of the airplane at St. Beuzille, France, in which Lady Kathleen Hartington, widow of the Marquess of Hartington, and daughter of Joseph P. Kennedy, former U.S. ambassador to Great Britain, was killed. She had accepted an invitation from a friend, Earl Fitzwilliam, one of Britain's wealthiest peers, to fly to Cannes, and was en route to Cannes from Paris when the plane encountered an electrical storm. Earl Fitzwilliam also died in the crash.
