Requested Recipes Piquant Tongue Mold

1 package lemon jelly powder 2 cups hot water 21/2 tbsps. vinegar .

1/8 tsp. salt 1 tsp. scraped onion 31/2 cups boiled tongue 1/2 cup chopped dill pickles

½ cup mayonnaise Dissolve lemon jelly powder in hot water. Add vinegar and salt. Chill. When slightly thickened, place in bowl of ice and water and whip with rotary egg beater until fluffy and thick like whipped cream. Fold in onion, tongue. pickles, and mayonnaise. Turn into loaf pan. Chill until firm in electric refrigerator. Unmold. Garnish with crisp lettuce and radishes. Makes

Plantation Milk Shake ¼ cup peanut butter 1 tbsp. honey 1/8 tsp. salt 2 cups milk ½ tsp. vanilla

nutmeg. Put peanut butter, honey and afternoon tea at Gander, Nfld., and salt in bowl. Add 4 cup milk and beat until smooth. Add the remaining milk, continuing to beat. Add vanilla. Pour into jar, cover and store in refrigerator until needed.

Blueberry Pie

Line a pie plate with a rich pie AD0605 pastry 14 inch thick. Mix 21/2 to 3 cups of blueberries with 1 tablespoon of flour, two-thirds cupful brown sugar and 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves. Fill the pie plate Add the top crust, crimp edges and bake in a hot oven 425 deg. F. for 10 minutes; reduce heat to moderate 350 deg. F. and bake another 2 minutes or until done.
