

## Cigarette Papers from Apple Tree Trimmings

Cigarette paper from fruit tree trimmings. That is what Shaw-Manson Ltd., a newly-formed Canadian company, hopes to manufacture in a proposed 10-ton-a-day Ontario pulp mill. Estimated cost of the mill is \$270,000 and cost of the property is not expected to exceed \$10,000, according to the prospectus offering 25,000 5 1/2% cumulative preferred and 4,998 common shares.

Investigations into the possibility of making pulp from fruit tree trimmings began in Toronto in 1936. Two years later the Pulp and

Paper Research Laboratory in Montreal picked up the idea and manufactured about 1,400 pounds of pulp. The process was patented in several countries by the Pangara Hoiting Corp., it is stated. Shaw-Manson will operate under an exclusive license from this corporation for Canada, United States, Great Britain and France.

According to the prospectus, pulp from fruit tree trimmings can be made at a cost of \$220 a ton f.o.b. mill, including allowances for royalty, wages and all materials, but not allowing for taxes or depreciation. It is intended to sell the pulp for \$325 a ton f.o.b. mill. With a production of 10 tons a day or 2,750 a year, estimated operating profit would be \$228,750 annually.

### Claim 'Milder Smoke'

In explaining this comparatively large profit, the mill backers point out that the new-type pulp will replace pulp which now costs at least \$450 a ton; and, say that it will be as good as, or better than, the pulp now used for cigarette paper.

Secret of the fruit tree pulp appears to be that it gives a "milder smoke" when converted into cigarette paper. The claim is that under test, a chemical analysis of the smoke from the burning paper from apple and other fruit tree trimmings, showed it to give off less acid and Aldehyde than the other first class cigarette papers burned under the same conditions.

For raw material, the company proposes to pick up fruit tree trimmings from Ontario orchards. According to estimates of the mill backers, based on Dept. of Agriculture figures, apple trees in that province would supply sufficient trimmings for over 40 tons of pulp a day. Other types of trees can supply another 25 tons if required. Location of the proposed mill is not stated.

On the question of markets the prospectus states "today, practically all cigarette paper produced on this continent is made of pulp from flax straw... the pulp will be sold in Canada, United States, Great Britain and France. It is expected that at first the main markets will be in United States."

Question which now faces the mill backers is: can the \$400,000 of risk capital be raised? The 3 1/2% cumulative preferred shares are being offered at \$20 a share. A commission of 95c per preferred share will be paid to each purchaser. Of this, 20c may be applied to the purchase of n.p.v. common shares selling for \$1 on the basis of one common share for each five preferred shares purchased. Shares are offered by the company itself or through purchasers' own brokers.

Chief executive officers of the company are H. C. Shaw, president; L. D. Shaw, secretary-treasurer, both of Montreal; G. J. Manson, vice-president and managing director, Ottawa; R. G. Shaw; A. A. M. Walsh, A. G. Hellstrom, all of Montreal and W. H. Boyle, Toronto, directors.

### Threshing for 65 Yrs. Uxbridge Farmers Retires

According to a report in the Uxbridge Times William Hamilton, veteran farmer living south of town in Uxbridge township has completed 63 years as a thresher. During all those years Hamilton lived on the same farm south of Uxbridge cemetery. Says the Uxbridge newspaper: "As a lad of fourteen Will started work with his father. Things were a bit different then, and he recalls the fact that he had to climb onto the top of the back wheel to blow the whistle on the upright boiler of the threshing machine. This was great fun and adventure. At the age of twenty-three he bought his own machine and began the route of Quaker Hill, through the Feasby settlement and Sandford. During two years he included several trips south, but soon returned to his original route and continued to serve there until his retirement. At first the engine was stoked with wood, then coal was used and in 1929 he discarded the old engine for a new shiny tractor.

During all these years Mr. Hamilton, who was an expert in his line, went back year after year to the same patrons and he declares a finer group of men can not be found anywhere. He also has high praise for the women as he says they are all wonderful cooks. Mr. Hamilton has made a host of good friends. He has earned a reputation worth more than gold, and he richly merits the honor that is his."

## They're Back to School



They're back-to-school — the most dangerous and deadly time of the year for Ontario's children. In the steadily increasing traffic on streets and highways, this is the period of greatest danger.

Last September, more children were killed and injured by motor cars in Ontario than in any other month. Always, at this time of the year, the number of tragic child accidents in traffic begins to soar. But this is needless as many of the accidents which killed 132 children, and injured 2,000 others in Ontario last year.

The provincial safety campaign, sponsored by the Department of Highways, and now supported by the press, radio, and many official and public agencies, shows clear evidence of success in reducing traffic accidents generally. But where children are concerned, teaching the rules of traffic safety and giving parental advice is not enough.

While driving, every motorist should arm himself with these personal admonitions and cautionings:

1. I'll consider every child I see on the street as a human danger signal.
2. In school zones or residential areas, I'll slow down, I'll come to the alert.
3. Wherever I suspect children may be playing, I'll drive with extra care.
4. I'll keep clear of bicycles. The youthful riders may know the rules, but even when they violate them I must watch out for them.
5. I'll be particularly careful when I see children on roller-skates, with a ball, with tricycles, scooters or coaster wagons.

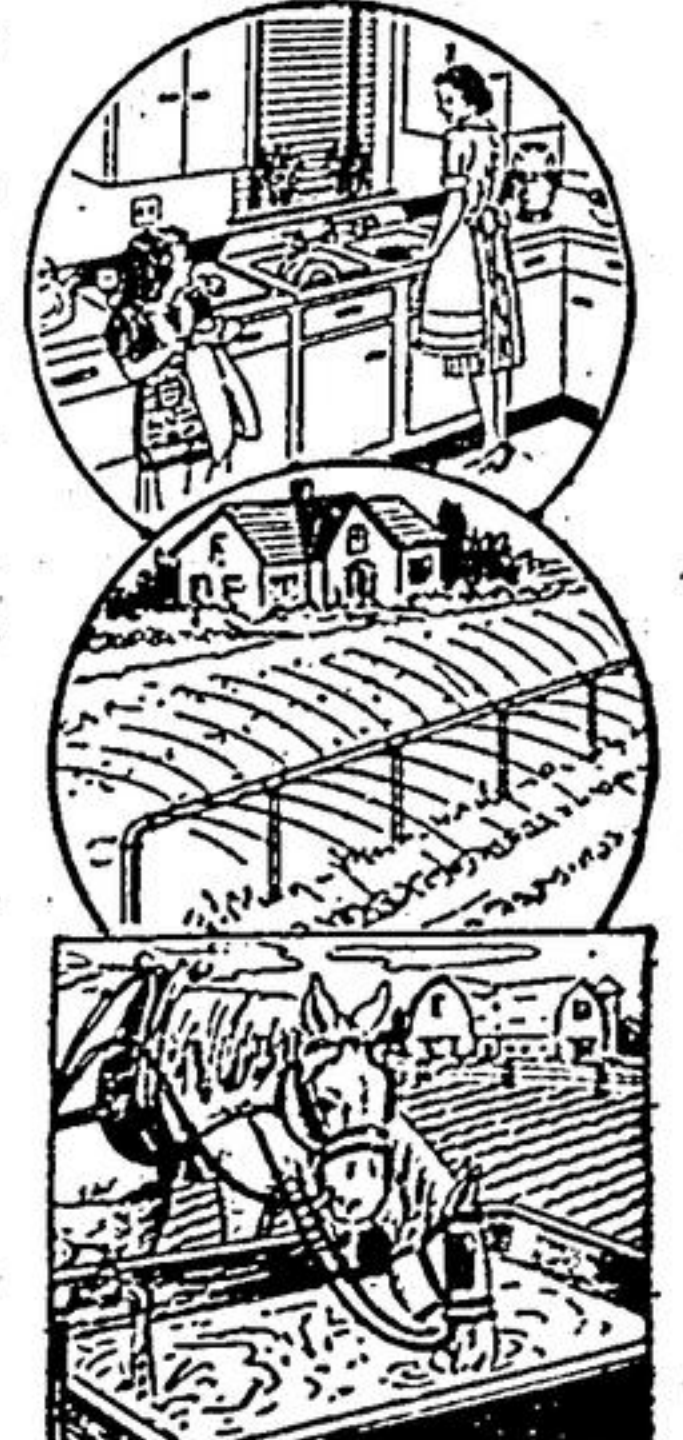
